AN INTRODUCTION TO

Our mission is to partner with parents to fulfill their children's baptismal promises. To do this, our Youth Ministry uses Stepping Stones to mark important milestones throughout a child's faith journey into adulthood. With each stone, we equip families with opportunities to learn together, encourage them in worship with blessings and empower them with tools to continue growing in faith at home.

1. BAPTISM

Before the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, parents must attend a brief class.

A heritage chest is given at baptism to help families collect and remember each stepping stone.

2. CELEBRATION OF BAPTISM

There is a worship celebration in January to celebrate everyone who was baptized the previous year.

3. WORSHIPPING TOGETHER

age: 3 years

Parents attend one event in August focusing on the seasons and symbols of worship and how to worship as a family.

The child is presented with their first bible and bible buddy during worship.

4. GOD'S STORY

age: 2nd grade

Parents and children attend an event that focuses on the bible and how to share God's Story at home.

The Kid's Study Bible is given during worship along with some of the staff's favorite bible stories and how they apply to their own lives.

5. FIRST COMMUNION

age: 2nd grade

Three events during Lent explore the stories significant to the sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion.

First communion is celebrated on Maundy Thursday after the traditional Seder Meal.
