

Installation of Bishop Emily Hartner

of the North Carolina Synod of the **Evangelical Lutheran Church**

Saturday, November 15 at Christ Lutheran Church

We are excited and pleased to host the installation of our new Bishop, Emily Hartner, on November 15 at 2:00 p.m. in our Sanctuary. This is kind of a big deal! Each Synod of the ELCA elects a bishop who serves for a six-year term. In most synods, you can serve multiple terms. A couple of months ago, our synod met with over 600 delegates in Greensboro and elected Pastor Emily Hartner as the 79th bishop of our synod, and the first female to hold that office.

Bishop Hartner grew up at Beth Eden Lutheran Church in Newton, NC. She graduated from Davidson College and received her Masters of Divinity from Yale Divinity School. She went on to earn her Masters of Sacred Theology degree from Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia.

Most recently, Bishop Hartner served as associate pastor of St. Marks in Charlotte and for the past eight years, she has been the pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, also in Charlotte.

Like I said, this is kind of a big deal!

First, we are the only church in the synod with a large enough sanctuary to host this event. We are anticipating about 900 people to come from all over North Carolina and far beyond to be a part of this celebration.

Second, our new presiding bishop of the ELCA, Bishop Yehiel Curry, will preside over the installation and preach. This will be quite an honor.

Third, dignitaries from several other full communion partners with the ELCA will be present as part of the installation, as well as a very large processional of our own North Carolina pastors and deacons.

Fourth, if you have ever wanted to experience high church pageantry at its finest, this installation will be filled with all of the pomp and circumstance.

Fifth, Mark Johanson and his team are assembling a mass choir made up of churches from around the entire state. The music and the size of this production will be overwhelming.

This is kind of a big deal! And I would encourage you to come and be a part of this celebration. Together, we are part of the ELCA, and this installation brings us together to celebrate the work of the Holy Spirit among us.



Sermon Series: Give It a Rest!

Overview: The number of people who work over 40 hours a week is staggering. The number of vacation hours unused is unbelievable. The pride that some people have of being busy is simply arrogant. The Bible says, "Give it a rest." First introduced in Creation and later reaffirmed during the Exodus was this concept of the Sabbath; a day to rejuvenate, reflect, reconnect. In short, a day of rest.

November 9 • Forced Sabbath

Psalm 23; Matthew 11:28-30

There are times in our lives that we are forced to rest. Covid was a forced Sabbath. Post-surgery recovery is a forced Sabbath. Unemployment can be a forced Sabbath. Instead of twiddling our thumbs, how does God use these periods of forced Sabbath to get our attention, redirect our priorities and give it a rest?

November 16 • The WHY

Genesis 1; Psalm 46; Mark 2:23–28

Innovative companies don't start with the WHAT; they start with the WHY. When we talk about the Sabbath, we begin not in a legalistic manner of what I can or cannot do, but rather we start with the WHY? Why do we even take that time to rest?

November 23 • Restoration

Exodus 20; Luke 5:12-16

The Sabbath is certainly to reconnect with God and with one another, but it is also for me. I need to rest. It is in that rest that my soul is restored so that I can be of use for others. If Jesus needed that time apart to rest, how much more do I need the same amount of rest?





Centering Prayer by D'LINDA HIGHUM

"Be still and know that I am God." -Psalm 46:10

Centering Prayer is a form of silent prayer meant to foster a deeper relationship with God. This prayer method gives the participant an opportunity to be still in the presence of God and welcome His work in their life.

A simple step-by-step guide for the beginner:

- 1. Choose a sacred word, such as "mercy," as a symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.
- 2. Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly and introduce the sacred word in your mind as the symbol to your consent to God's presence and action within.
- 3. When your thoughts intrude, gently introduce your sacred word in your mind again.
- 4. At the end of the prayer period (usually 20 minutes), remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes.
- 5. End with the Lord's Prayer.

The prayer can be practiced alone, but starting in a group gives you a sense of the prayer and group members can answer questions that may come up.

Tutors and Homework Helpers Needed on Wednesdays

Wednesdays Ablaze is such an important time that we set aside for faith formation during the week. As a church, we are blessed to have regular midweek programming and to have robust Wednesday evening programming. We have Adult Bible Studies, Small Groups, exercise classes, and engaging programming for children and youth. When we make time for faith, study and community during the week, we are living into the truth that discipleship is not just from Sunday to Sunday, but every day.

On Wednesday evenings, our rooms are buzzing with lively three-yearolds, curious kindergarteners, active elementary school students, and creative high schoolers practicing in the Pit for the Xperience. There is one group we are missing: our middle schoolers and families.

While we have a strong confirmation ministry for our middle schoolers, we know how important it is for them to come midweek as well. They have a lot going on in their world from school... to sports... to social media (and more!). Wednesdays are an opportunity for faith development as well as a respite and rock for finding strength and community during the week. They need each other!

We are working on bringing in middle school students for Wednesdays Ablaze. With parental permission, we will be picking up the participating youth to bring them to church. We will be going to their school to help families manage schedules, pick-up times and traffic so that our middle schoolers aren't missing out on faith formation. Faith formation that we pray sets their hearts ablaze for Christ.

We are still working out pick-up schedules and details, but in the event that our middle schoolers arrive before dinner, we would like to have tutors and homework helpers available from 3:30 – 5:00 p.m. This may help them get an edge on their work and leave room for fellowship and fun for the rest of the evening.

If you are trained in a certain field and can tutor, wonderful! If you think you can sit with a student to walk through instructions or be a supportive presence, wonderful! We would very much appreciate your help as we do our best to support our students. If you can help or if you have any questions, please let me know. Thank you!

Parent Connection

Every year we are blessed to have a member of our congregation, Sergeant Rob Stark (Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department Special Investigations – ABC Unit) educate families on the dangers and emerging trends of drug and alcohol use among teens. This is a powerful and eye-opening event for youth and their parents to learn about the realities teens face today—and how parents can stay involved, informed and supportive. Last year Sergeant Stark shared stories from the field. He discussed how drug dealers are disguising dangerous substances to look like harmless everyday items—particularly candy. We also talked about the marketing of vapes and alcoholic drinks to target youth. These products are intentionally deceptive, designed to lure in young people and make dangerous substances seem harmless or fun. Parents have said how valuable it is to attend each year as their children grow and develop, as it makes an impact on them where they are at that time. It is an opportunity for parents to have these important and continuing conversations. We are thankful to Rob Stark for his service to our community and to our church.




