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Pastor's Perspective

Checking Off The Big Rocks of 2023

When our Church Council gets together after every Annual Meeting (this year on January 28), we always put together a list of The Big Rocks that we want to tackle during the year. In the beginning of 2023, we laid out eleven of these major goals:

1. Good Soil Campaign: Completed! With the closing of Christ South, we gave people the option to move their donations earmarked for the worship center for South to someplace else. Most kept their money in this fund while a few moved it to the Endowment, another ministry or to the General Fund.

2. South Land Vision: *In Process* We have a task force that met all year to dream big about a new vision for the South land. While we have several options, zoning has become a problem. We will present these options at the Annual Meeting on January 28 with town meetings to follow.

3. Thrive Financials: Completed! We worked with Thrive Day School as they struggled with finances. Because of the ratios, the needs and the requirements, this is a difficult ministry with a huge and generous heart. Christ Lutheran helped with strategy and loans.

4. Land Trust: *On Hold* We had a task force to dream of ways that we could help with affordable housing. Because of the enormity of this problem in Charlotte, we need to find ways to partner with other agencies to make a difference in our community.

5. Evangelism Strategy: Never Ending! The best evangelism is a one-on-one conversation with someone in your life in need of the Gospel. It is never a one and done talk, but an ongoing conversation and talk, trusting that the Holy Spirit will move hearts.

6. Christ Lutheran Children Center Kindergarten Expansion: Completed We looked into expanding our CLCC ministry and quickly discovered that because of codes and restrictions, we cannot expand our Center to include Kindergarten.

7. Christ South Community: Completed Following the closing of Christ South, we made a concerted effort to reach out to those who attended that campus for pastoral care and guidance as they searched for a new home and wrestled with questions.

8. Music and the Community: Completed! Following Covid, we wanted to make an intentional effort to use our facilities to welcome the community through the arts. With many concerts, community events and the Tasha Layton concert, we feel good about this outreach.

9. Lessons Learned from Christ South: Completed We had a task force put together to review the closing of Christ South and ask what we did well and where we stumbled. Those lessons were shared and discussed at Council.

10. Strategy for Capital Improvements: Completed With a building that continues to age, we put together a list of capital improvements and set aside money for future repairs. The replacement of the carpet and tile downstairs was a result of this intentional upkeep.

11. Christ Concord Success: Completed With the decision to continue with Christ Concord, we tasked our Minister, Willie Pinson, to work with a team for a strategy to grow. They have done this, wrote down a plan and are working together for success.

It was a busy and productive year. I felt the Council kept their eye on these Big Rocks all year long. And by the time we have our next newsletter, I'll be able to report the new Big Rocks for 2024.

UPCOMING SERMON SERIES Fearless: Lessons from David

There might be more written about David in the Bible than any other person outside of Jesus. We follow him from being anointed as a young shepherd boy, to being on the lam as a fugitive, to ruling as a beloved king all the way to his death. If there were a single word to describe his life, it might just be FEARLESS.

January 14 • Fearless Youth

David was the runt of the litter, the youngest of seven sons to Jesse. When Samuel anointed him out in the field as the next king of Israel, this pre-teen received it not with brashness but with a humble confidence in God. He was fearless. --1 Samuel 16:1-13; Matthew 19:13-14

January 21 • Fearless Integrity

After his anointing, David didn't begin as king. For a while he served King Saul until Saul's jealousy over David's popularity drove David into the Wilderness as a fugitive. When given the opportunity to kill Saul, David refused. It was a matter of integrity. He was fearless. --1 Samuel 24:1-7; Philippians 4:8-9

January 28 • Fearless Worship

When is the last time you danced as if no one were looking? When they brought the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem in a parade, David danced and worshipped as if only before his God. While some sneered and ridiculed him, he was fearless. --2 Samuel 6:12-16; Psalm 100

February 4 • Fearless Decision

The Bible says that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of Wisdom. At some point, while fearless in so many ways, David lost his fear of the Lord and made a decision that he not only regretted but would mar his reputation and memory forever. Unfortunately, he was fearless. --2 Samuel 11:1-27

February 11 • Fearless Death

How does one respond to their impending death? We would like to think we would be full of faith and fearless. But no one knows until that time comes. King David, a man after God's own heart, knew that he was near the end. And he faced it, as he did most of his life, fearlessly. *--I Kings 1:1-4, 2 Kings 2:1-4; 2 Timothy 4:6-8*

SUNDAY LENTEN SERIES Villains, Heroes & Nobodies

God uses all kinds of people to reach His ends. God calls on those who are able and willing to build His kingdom. We may judge those people and regard them as Villains, Heroes or Nobodies, but we would do better to see them for who they are: His hands and feet in the world.

February 18 • Esther

Esther was a nobody. She was not born of a noble family. She possessed no great talents of leadership, wasn't a military strategist, and had mastered none of the arts. But when called upon to do what must be done, she mustered the bravery to stand in the gap. She

advocated for her people and shows us that we all have a part to play, however humble our beginnings. --Esther 7:1-10; 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

February 25 • Nicodemus

Nicodemus was a Pharisee, which makes him a villain. Aren't all Pharisees evil? Weren't they all constantly seeking to trap Jesus and undermine His authority? While Nicodemus was, indeed, a Pharisee, he didn't exhibit the characteristics we so often associate with that ilk. Nicodemus was curious, a truth seeker. He came humbling to our Lord. He knew that God was active, and rather than writing Jesus off as an interloper, he sought out truth that would shake his worldview. --John 3:1-21; Micah 6:6-8

March 3 • Cyrus of Persia

The Messiah is the one person God has anointed to lead His people. He is THE agent of the LORD. How can it be that the Prophet Isaiah calls Cyrus the King of Persia the Messiah!? The Messiah, or Christ (Messiah in Greek) is a very special person. Cyrus was just that. We think we understand what God is going to do. We think we know who God wants. We think there is a divine order that is completely understood. Cyrus the Polytheistic ruler of the blood thirsty conquering nation of Persia is a villain. But of course, no one is just one thing, even "villains." We think we know God, but we should always be ready to see Him, in all people, in any place, and at any time. *--Isaiah 44:24-45:1; Matthew 9:9-13*

March 10 • Joshua

Joshua was a hero of great faith. He and Caleb where undeterred about the Giants they saw in the land. It was an exceedingly good land and the LORD saw fit to give it to them. His faithfulness was in the minority, and because of it the Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years. It can be hard to stand for what you know to be true; Joshua did it for generations. 40 years later, he finally walks into the land that was given to his people and is informed that the Israelites had a reputation that preceded them. A reputation that sapped the courage of the inhabitants. Our strength comes from the LORD and Joshua knew it. --Joshua 2:9b-11; John 20:26-29

March 17 • Centurion

Roman oppressors are not welcome among the Jewish people. To the Roman Imperial command, the Jewish people are nothing more than a trouble and tribute. Sometimes the mold is broken, as when a Centurion sought Jesus out to heal his servant. Jesus would have been right to point out all the evil Romans had done to God's Chosen people, but instead engages and shows us that the humility of even a Roman Villain can be edifying. --Matthew 8:5-13; Philippians 2:6-11; Philippians 2:25-29

Psalm 8: Eco-Friendly is a small group that takes a look at God's creation and our role as stewards of what He as given us. We meet in the evenings on the last Monday of each month at Christ Providence (except around Christmas) to discuss various environmental topics from air pollution to waste water management. We also have taken on a project through the NCDOT's Adopt-a-Highway Program to conduct litter cleanup along 2.8 miles of Providence Road in front of Christ Lutheran's Providence campus. During 2023, we collected 49 large bags of litter and recyclable materials during four quarterly cleanup events.

Home Communion Assistants

Communion is a vital part of our faith. It is the opportunity to literally commune with our Lord. It is also a chance to be part of community. When we eat we tend to do so with others; it's natural to share a meal. Our Lord knew this when He instituted His Supper.

Not everyone has the ability to meet us in person on Sunday mornings. For various reasons they have found themselves home-bound or in rehabilitation facilities and can't make it to worship and communion.

To ensure that these members of our community are not forgotten and have His blessing that is the Eucharist, we send people out to bring communion to them. In this way, they know they are missed and are a part of the Body of Christ at Christ Lutheran.

We need help. We need volunteers to bring communion to those who are unable to come to worship. As a volunteer, you would be given the elements in a kit on a Sunday and be responsible for visiting those who are home-bound. There is some training to help you with the rite of administration and material to remind you. The commitment is minimal but the impact is huge. You will bring the joy of fellowship and the very grace of God to one of our brothers or sisters in Christ.

Garden Ministry Yearly Recap

Christ Lutheran's Garden Ministry has been blooming with fresh vegetables all year! Through November 2023, our "Growing to Give" Garden Ministry has participated in 44 "Pickin' Parties" – and the results are impressive! Compared to 2022, the difference in total produce donated increased by over 1000 pounds! This increase is particularly important for our community, whom this ministry donates pounds of vegetables each week.

In 2023, CLC's Garden Ministry partnered with Roots Farm. The Farm also donated vegetables to pair with CLC's Garden to help serve our McClintock community each week. These vegetables were included in McPIE's "Feed A Family" initiative to add fresh vegetables in family grocery bags.

Faith Fellowship: The Bible & Beyond 10:00-10:45 a.m. at Christ Providence (Forum A&B) -or- Online (Zoom)

(JAN. 7 - FEB. 11) Isaiah For You. The man Isaiah was called by God to be a prophet some 700 years before the coming of Christ. Beginning in 740 B.C., he stepped into his role as God's mouthpiece proclaiming God's Truth to His chosen people in Judah for possibly 60 years. The times were tumultuous due to the people's unfaithfulness to God and constant threats of powerful neighboring nations. Isaiah was sent to deliver the message of both God's great judgment of the people for their infidelity followed by a time of great comfort and restoration - and ultimately the beautiful prophecy of eternal salvation for all believers. The Biblical book of Isaiah, whose contents can be challenging and length intimidating, provides the most comprehensive prophetic picture of Jesus Christ in the entire Old Testament and is most often quoted in the New Testament as the prophecies unfold.

(FEB. 18 - MARCH 24) *Luke – Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts and Outlaws*. "Jesus came for all" is the important message pastor and author Adam Hamilton heralds in his most current series, a Lenten study of Jesus's life and ministry as recorded in the Gospel of Luke. Through Luke's stories we find His care and compassion for all as He welcomes both sinners and outcasts, often to the dismay of his closest followers. He came to lift up the lowly and all whom society considers insignificant or unfit by worldly standards. He came to give us His allencompassing love and mercy, the mercy of the Cross.

(APRIL 7 - MAY 12) *The Early Church.* How did the early church begin? By whom? How did it sustain persecution, controversy, division? What can we learn from the past? This study seeks to answer these questions and more by leading us through different topics related to the early church. Each topic presents a corresponding key question for us today. How can we evangelize effectively? How can we stand up for our faith? How do we present faith to an unbelieving world? What does it mean to be truly spiritual? These age-old questions are both inspiring and eyeopening, prompting believers of each generation to think deeply about the past, present, and future of the church and our dynamic role in keeping the faith. —led by Miriam Morrison, Barbara Burton, Milt Martin,
