# Christ Lutheran's Fourth Campus: CHRIST ONLINE

Two generations ago, we wondered if a person could actually "attend" a religious event through TV... and Billy Graham proved to us that watching one of his revivals was real, authentic and impactful. One generation ago we asked whether or not you could pray with someone who is on TV, and many televangelists answered that with a resounding yes. More recently, we are asking whether watching a church service on the internet is a legitimate form of worship. And with about 1,000 reaches each week and dozens of testimonies, we have discovered at Christ Lutheran the answer to be, "It is."

For years we have had an online presence through our website and Facebook Live. Most of that has been passive viewing– that is, we provide the video and viewers watch. But all that is about to change.

As of March 1, we have hired Alexis Williams to be our Christ Online Minister. Alexis is a daughter of the congregation, having been baptized, confirmed and married here. She already has been doing our social media for the past year and now will take on the additional role as the minister of Christ Online.



Her duties will include engaging with those who join us online for worship at all three campuses each Sunday. Training a bank of volunteers at all campuses, Alexis will see who is watching, ask for any prayer concerns, answer any questions about the church and encourage people for further participation. In addition, she will

promote an online bible study for these viewers to have a midweek study. Eventually, she will organize face-to-face gatherings at centrally located pubs and coffee shops for our online viewers to meet one another.


But Alexis cannot do this alone.

Alexis will need a team of about 12 people from all three campuses who would each like to play a small part in this big ministry. This might be covering one of the services at our three other campuses, or meeting the online viewers at a coffee shop, or even helping to lead a midweek bible study online. Consider reaching out to her to get involved. Her email address is *awilliams@christelca.org*.

Who worships online? Elderly who are shut in, members who are recovering from surgery or are too sick to attend, families that are at dance competitions and soccer tournaments and visitors who are checking us out online. The numbers are growing. Online worship is never going to go away. We can fight it, lament it, deny it or we can join it to make it even better and more engaging with Christ Online.

By the way, as with so many other ministries here at Christ Lutheran, our goal is to be a teaching congregation for others. Therefore, we have received a grant from the ELCA to cover the personnel costs of this position for one year so that we can learn how to do this effectively and share our findings across the country.

# MARCH 1 - MARCH 29 Lenten Sermon Series: *Break (It) Down*

OVERVIEW | Fasting, daily prayer, service, evangelism, study. Many find these spiritual disciplines difficult to do. How do I fast? When do I pray? Where do I share my faith? How can I carve out the time? To help us ease into these practices, throughout Lent we will read through the entire book of Mark, lifting up one spiritual practice to try each week with practical tips. We will break it down into manageable bites, and in doing so, we look for ways in which God will break us down, remove our barriers, overcome our excuses so that during this journey through Lent we will walk the walk and talk the talk... together.

### March 1 • A Week of Fasting

Biblically speaking, fasting has nothing to do with detoxifying the body or dropping weight quickly. It is a spiritual practice that removes some desired food/ beverage in order to heighten your awareness of your spiritual walk. Today we will focus on the spiritual practice of fasting and give helpful tips on how to spend the week using this tool to draw you nearer to God. *Mark 1:9-15; Acts 13:1-3* [[Bible Reading: Mark 1-3]]

### March 8 • Sharing Our Faith

In the Parable of the Sower, Jesus talks about lavishly scattering the seed of God's Word. As the sower, you don't have to be overly concerned where it lands. God will bring forth the fruit when it lands on good soil. This week, let's talk about how to scatter that seed by sharing your faith. *Mark 4:1-9; Acts 17:22-28* **[[Bible Reading: Mark 4-6]]** 

### March 15 • Daily Prayer

Of all the things that the disciples could have asked Jesus to teach them, the only one was, "Lord, teach us to pray."

Evidently, prayer is more than closing your eyes, bowing your head, folding your hands and telling God what you want. The disciples saw prayer as the source of Jesus life and breath and ministry. And so will you. Today we will talk about how to set aside intentional time to pray and give suggestions on how you can dedicate this coming week to the discipline of prayer. *Mark* 9:2-8; *Psalm* 145:14-21 **[[Bible Reading: Mark 7-9]]** 

### March 22 • Serving Others

We speak a good word about service, but living it out selflessly is difficult. James and John reveal the honesty of our fallen hearts in wanting more glory and recognition, even as they follow Jesus in service. How do we serve this week? Mother Teresa put it well when she said, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love." This week, how can you serve in small things with great love... and do it anonymously? *Mark* 10:35-45; *Philippians* 2:1-5 [[Bible Reading: Mark 10-12]]

### March 29 • Blessing Our Enemies

It is one thing to not retaliate against your enemies, but another thing to bless them and love them. It is an incredibly difficult thing that Jesus asks of us when he says, "Love your enemies. Bless those who persecute you." This final week we will put this last spiritual practice to the test. Who has wronged you? Who do you daydream about to get revenge? This week, practice this important discipline of blessing your enemies by singling out the one God is placing on your heart. Mark 14:53-61a; Romans 12:14-21 [[Bible Reading: Mark 13-16]]

# **April is Child Abuse Awareness Month**

It is a serious problem that affects our most vulnerable and often goes unreported. The immediate affects can scar the body, but the lasting affects damage the soul.

We are dedicated to protecting our children. We do background checks on all volunteers and staff. We have rigid policies in place when it comes to ministries with children. This is so important because we know that child abuse crosses over income lines, racial differences and education levels. Child abuse affects us all, and the impact lasts a lifetime.

To lift up the awareness, prevention and care for the victims, we want to invite you to join us for a three part adult education series on Wednesday nights, April 22, 29 and May 6 (in Forum A & B from 6:15-7:30pm). We will hear stories from survivors, talk about signs to look for and provide resources for help-particularly for adult survivors of child abuse. This will not be an easy conversation, but it will be an important one. We are called to speak for those who have no voice, to protect those who are defenseless and to provide hope and healing for those who suffer. It all begins with having the courage to have the conversation.

# **Faith Community Nurse**

It is the elderly person who has a doctor's visit and her children live hours away. It is the young mom recovering from surgery with two little ones at home. It is the newly diagnosed person who needs help sorting out medications. It is the one with high blood pressure who needs her pressure taken regularly.

Have you had medical guestions and wondered who to ask? Have you had difficulty finding a ride to a physical therapy session? Do you know when to call the doctor or go to the ER? These aren't just elderly issues. Many of us have similar questions.

We would like to put together a team of retired or part time nurses from the congregation to help us create a health care ministry of volunteers and professionals to meet the growing medical needs within the congregation. While these are for now volunteer positions, the hope is to develop this into something that is sustainable as a staff position one day. But first we need to see if we have the interest and the need.



# Four Small Groups

South Sisters (1) is the women's ministry at Christ South and was started to simply build community. We realized that as individuals we had amazing gifts, but if we channeled all of our energy into a purpose we all supported, we would be an unstoppable force driven by the Holy Spirit. We all prayed that God would show us our gifts and where they were needed.

As we prayed, I remembered that years before I'd met Anna and Bud Moore, and that they were part of a small group that made pillows for breast cancer survivors that underwent mastectomies (Sew, Stuff & Stitch Pillows (2)). I reached out to Anna, and she was so generous with her time and resources. She put me in touch with the Breast Health Navigator at Novant Matthews. To date, in addition to the beautiful pillows that Anna's group creates, we have assembled and delivered 96 bags of items mastectomy survivors need in their healing.

Our hearts were so filled with gratitude and purpose that we wanted to do more. We will soon be assembling 90 larger bags for survivors undergoing chemotherapy in all nine oncology departments at Novant Matthews. These bags will include lovingly crafted knitted shawls and blankets from our Knitters for Christ (3) ministry, as well as handmade blankets from Joanie Hunt and her Christ South outreach team (4). In addition to the blankets and shawls, we are including dry mouth mouthwash, toothpaste, a toothbrush, lip balm, Lemonhead candy, a glass water bottle, antibacterial wipes and a word search book... everything one needs to be as comfortable as possible in the treatment rooms.

Four small groups coming together just shows how God's plans far exceed ours. We were just hoping to help a few people out. Indeed we did and are, but all involved were given the real gift; understanding what to do with the gifts God gives you. "The meaning of life is to find your gift. The purpose of life is to give it away."

# **The Endowment Challenge**

Thanks to a family's generous challenge, if at least \$25,000 is donated to the CLC Endowment Fund by August 30th, they will provide a \$25,000 match to that Endowment Fund! As of December 31st, the CLC Endowment Funds' balances totaled \$975,300. This will help push the Fund totals beyond \$1,000,000!!

### Why is that important?

Gifts to the Endowment are permanent legacy gifts. As the total balance grows, so do earnings, making the collective impact greater with each gift. An Endowment of \$1M or more will mean distributions of over \$40,000 year after year into the future.

### What's the difference between the Operating Fund and the Endowment Funds?

The CLC Operating Fund covers the church's annual budget (salaries, buildings and associated expenses, programming, outreach, etc.) and we encourage everyone to continue their annual giving.

The Endowment Funds cover additional and unexpected expenses beyond the annual budget:

- •Endowment Fund I provides additional support for Outreach and is directed by the Benevolence Committee.
- •Endowment Fund II can be used for any need and is directed by the Church Council.



# **Upcoming Studies for Faith Fellowship Class**

### **Faith Fellowship: The Bible and Beyond** CLASS MEETS SUNDAYS (10:00 a.m. in Forum A)

From March 1 through April 5, Faith Fellowship Sunday School class will be focusing on *John: The Gospel of Light and Life*. In this 6-week Lenten series by pastor and author Adam Hamilton, we will explore Jesus' life – from birth, to His teachings, and to His ultimate death and Resurrection. Each week's lesson will focus on the profound, connecting themes of light and life – brought into our world by Jesus – and their enduring impact today.

Then, from April 19 through May 17, our focus will shift to *Eternity is Now in Session*. Most of us think of eternity as something that begins after we die; however, Jesus doesn't talk about eternity that way. This 5-week DVD session by pastor and author John Ortberg leads us in a radical discovery of what the Bible really says about salvation – and the interactive fellowship and joy that exist between Father, Son and Holy Spirit in the here, now and every minute of every day.

To combine a substance addiction with the "need for speed," one naturally would conclude that disaster is immanent. However, all is well: the substance addiction is fabric. The heavy metal– a sewing machine. And the results... **are wonderful**. In 2019, Quilters for Christ produced 272 quilts for charity, 1877 pillows for post-op breast cancer patients, dress kits, backpacks (filled with school supplies), and over 150 cheerful pillowcases for local children's hospitals and the Ronald McDonald House.

Through sewing, we seek to provide comfort and aid worldwide. Fancy is not our focus, but rather quantity and function. That level of production requires a lot of busy hands. We sew, obviously, but not all of us. There are all sorts of tasks that are needed in the creation of these items, including fabric cutting, ironing, tying knots (our method of quilting), stuffing pillows, organizing supplies, machine maintenance and always procuring more materials. Please forgive if this sounds like sweat shop drudgery– we really do have fun during our weekly meetings.

Now comes the recruitment pitch- (cough),- I mean, invitation to contribute to the cause. We are seeking "sew-ists" of all skill levels- no one need be a "sew-pro." The sewing is super simple. We **meet every Wednesday at Christ Providence, from 9:30 a.m. to noon in Center Six** to assemble the quilt "sandwich" and finish the edges. Most all of the sewing is done at our respective homes. So, if life's realities make Wednesday mornings an impossibility, you can certainly still be a valuable participating member. Or perhaps, one would like to learn/ practice some sewing basics- we can get you started. In fact, we can provide pre-cut "kits" for easy sewing at home and on your own schedule.

If anyone has fabrics to share, please think of us. We function on donations and consume large amounts of supplies each year. Also, if you are a member of Thrivent Financial, please ask the church office about how to direct "free" money to your favorite charitable effort.

They can answer, ask guestions and earn rewards by participating in the conversation. We will have additional events for this group, which is the fastest growing part of Christ South.

Our congregational budget allocates 12% of every dollar given to Christ Lutheran for Benevolence. Our Benevolence sends money outside of these walls to help our local community and other communities. We help many local agencies and ministries right here in Charlotte, and also send money to support Lutheran agencies, camps and seminary scholarships. Over the next several newsletters, we will highlight some of the benefactors of our grants.

The largest benefactor is our NC Synod and the ELCA. Each year we send \$100,000 or more to support the ministries of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) through the North Carolina Synod. The ELCA in turn uses the money to support its ministries, mission developers, etc... Over 40% of all monies received by the ELCA are used as financial support grants for current and new mission starts, ministries and congregations. Over the past 2+ decades, Christ Lutheran has benefitted from five different mission development grants: McAlpine, McClintock Worshipping Community, Christ South, Christ Concord and now Christ Online.
