

## **Kick-Off Sunday: September 7 RENEWING YOUR COMMITMENT!**

New Years is the time to renew your commitment to lose weight and save money. Anniversaries are a time to renew your commitment to your spouse. And Kick-Off Sunday, September 7, is a time to renew your commitment to your faith.

On September 7, we resume Sunday School along with our three worship times:



Overview: After a period of anticipating the imminent return of Jesus, Christians have come to the realization that there might be a period of waiting that includes trials and suffering. Christians found themselves foreigners in this pagan and often hostile world. In this epistle of grace, 1 Peter encourages these early believers to hold fast to what he calls A Living Hope.

#### **September 7 • A Living Hope**

When we use that word, hope, we talk about hoping it will not rain today or hoping that our team wins. This is merely wishful thinking. But when the Bible speaks of hope, it is a "sure and certain" hope that because Jesus lives, one day, so will we. To this group of struggling believers, Peter's encourages them by calling this A Living Hope. 1 Peter 1:1–12; Matthew 5:1–12

#### September 14 • A Royal Priesthood

You are royalty! How did this sound to Peter's audience – poor, struggling Gentiles who were persecuted for their faith? "You are royalty, a child of the king, heir to the promise and blessed beyond measure." Pie in the sky platitudes or the reality for those who are in Christ? 1 Peter 1:13-2:12; Matthew 5:13-16

#### **September 21 • How Then Shall We Live?**

Having been saved through faith and named as royalty, how then shall we live? Peter strikes an important balance for the believer. With one eye firmly fixed on the eternal prize yet to come, the other eve remains focused on the work to be done here and now with the breaking in of the Kingdom of God. 1 Peter 2:11-3:12; Matthew 5:17-20

#### September 28 • The Necessity of Suffering

Peter affirms the hard teaching of Jesus that in this world, you will have trouble. Who wants to hear that? And yet when we ask where God is in our suffering, he is not avoiding it or preventing it or closing his eyes to it. Our God is a very present help IN times of trouble. Look to the cross to see where our God can be found in our suffering. 1 Peter 3:13-4:11: Psalm 46: Matthew 5:43-48

#### October 5 • Never Give Up

In 1941, Winston Churchill gave the shortest, most powerful and memorable commencement speech ever. Speaking at his alma mater, Harrow School of London, he went up to the podium, paused for a moment, and simply said, "Never Give Up!" No one has forgotten it. As Peter concludes his letter, his message is the same, encouraging these believers to stay the course. 1 Peter 4:12-5:14; 2 Timothy 4:6–8; Matthew 6:19–21



# Join a Small Group This Fall

# **Exciting Nursery Updates** for the New School Year

As we prepare for a new school year, we're excited to share some important updates about our nursery!

#### **Sunday School in the Nursery**

Beginning this fall, we'll be introducing Sunday School lessons during the Sunday School hour in the nursery. Since we already stream both Traditional and Contemporary services in the nursery, we wanted to use the time between them to offer meaningful, ageappropriate learning for our youngest congregation members. This new offering will include a short lesson, a story, and a fun craft or activity. We're thrilled to be launching this new initiative!

#### **Staffing and Volunteer Needs**

Our nursery is staffed by some incredible individuals; however, it is a lot to expect them to give of their time each and every Sunday. Despite our efforts to hire additional paid nursery staff—through our church, CLCC and Care.com—we've not yet found a suitable candidate.

To ensure we remain in compliance with our Child Protection Policy and continue to provide safe, nurturing care, we are turning to our church families to help fill the gaps. Moving forward, we are asking all families who use the nursery to volunteer at least three Sundays per quarter, during their preferred service. A Sign-Up Genius link will be sent out soon, and a physical sign-up sheet will also be available. We sincerely appreciate your partnership in helping our nursery run smoothly.

#### **A Personal Update**

Lastly, I want to share a personal piece of news about why it is so critical that we make updates to our nursery staffing: this October, I'll be taking maternity leave to welcome my first child! I will be out through the end of the calendar year, and during that time will be unable to assist with any emergency staffing needs. My husband and I are overjoyed to welcome our son, and I'm deeply grateful for the support of our Christ Lutheran Church family as we enter this new season. Thank you for your continued care and involvement in this important ministry!

#### **Child Protection Training**

Over the past few months, church staff has been hard at work updating our Child Protection Policy. This policy exists to ensure that anyone involved with our children and youth is equipped to minister in ways that are healthy and appropriate for everyone involved. The updating process is lengthy, but necessary to ensure that our policies are up to date with current needs.

Our Protection Policy, developed by our staff and approved by Council, requires volunteers to attend training each year and receive background checks every three years. This requirement is for any volunteer who has in-person interactions with children and youth, including through McPIE, VBS, Sunday School, youth group, Wednesdays Ablaze and many other programs. This year, we are working to transition back to in-person training, something we had to stop during the COVID-19 pandemic.

We will be offering two training opportunities this fall. The first, on Wednesday, September 3, will be from 6:00-8:00 p.m., with dinner included. The second, on Saturday, September 6 will be from 9:00-11:00 a.m. If you have any plans to work with our children and youth during the upcoming school year, please mark these very important dates on your calendars and we'll be glad to see you there!



# Summer of Engagement

Summer 2025 was hot in many ways! Freedom School, Science Camp, Charlotte Latin and Lutheridge/Lutherock provided many McClintock students fun, safe, engaging opportunities to learn and explore!

Freedom School was full of learning, reading and fun activities for the 70 Scholars who participated this summer. While learning to foster a love of reading, students built their reading comprehension skills and learned ways to make a difference in themselves, their family, country and world. These Scholars built relationships between each other and with their interns and mentors. Ms. Joosten and her Servant Leader Interns were really wonderful and ensured these students had an impactful summer! Activities have exposed students to a plethora of areas around Charlotte and enabled students to explore science, skating, NASCAR, banking and more! Field trips included the Schiele Museum, Kate's Skates, Charlotte Motor Speedway and M&F Bank to learn about the day and life of someone who works in the banking industry.

Level 1's and 2's (elementary aged students) participated in a city-wide field day and won first place!!! Participants showcased what they learned this summer through spoken word, song, dance and skits at the finale. They gave parents and volunteers a glimpse into Harambee cheers and chants and closed with the theme song, "Something Inside So Strong."

Science Camp fostered a love of science and technology! 60+ future scientists and engineers experienced hands-on activities, covering topics such as forensics, innovation and design, biology, mindfulness, chemistry, art and math! At the end of camp, participants showcased their hard work and experiments and shared with family and volunteers. Field trips to UNC Charlotte and Activate enabled students to envision life on a college campus, see majors and classes in action, and build their teamwork and communication skills! After analyzing post-camp survey questions, 88% of students said camp helped them understand science better and 78% said camp helped them feel better about their ability to learn science concepts. Camp was certainly a success!

McClintock students also had the opportunity to experience overnight camps and explore new parts of the North Carolina mountains! Lutheridge and Lutherock were picturesque locations where 16 students explored for a week! Themes included High In The Sky, Hammock Hangout, Fire and Water, Cave N Wave, and Blueridge Expeditions. Camp Agape also hosted three students who participated in the Night Owls program.

Charlotte Latin School was generous again in offering four scholarships for students to participate in baseball and girls basketball! Summer was full of fun, engagement, relationship building and learning!
