In-Person Worship at all Campuses

With Governor Cooper easing restrictions with Phase 3 of the Covid protocol, we are now allowed to have in-person worship service. I am so excited for this reunion! As we carefully have put together specific guidelines to do this safely, we seek to fulfill what Jesus described as the two greatest commandments. The first one is **Love the Lord your God with all of your heart and soul and strength and mind**. Corporate worship has always been at the heart of our spiritual lives.

Luke 4:16 -- He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom.

Hebrews 10:24, 25 -- And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together,...

The second greatest commandment, Jesus said, was like the first, **Love your neighbor** as yourself. While we will still offer online worship for all of our campuses (that is never going away), we have adopted this covenant for those who desire to join us in-person. In-person worship is not mandatory in any way. However, those who choose to join us are asked to follow these procedures out of love and respect for our neighbor.

- 1. If you are sick or have been in contact with someone testing positive, please stay home for 14 days and worship online.
- 2. Each campus will have a limited number of people per service. RSVP is required through REALM, calling the church office (704-366-1595) or emailing Connie Kramer (*ckramer@christelca.org*). RSVPs will open each Mondays prior to the following Sunday worship.
- 3. Doors will be opened 30 minutes before each worship service.
- 4. No nursery will be available at this time.
- 5. All doors will remain open to limited physical touch.
- 6. While stairs will be encouraged, the elevator will be available.
- 7. Masks will be mandatory. Please bring your own masks
- 8. Temperatures will be checked as people enter inside.
- 9. Ushers will seat people from the front of the sanctuary to the back, ensuring that we achieve social distance between families.
- 10. Only worship leaders on the chancel will lead worship without masks.
- 11. There will only be a verbal sharing of the peace.
- 12. Offerings will be received as people exit worship.
- 13. There will be no coffee hour before or after worship. Worshippers will be asked to leave the building after the service has ended.
- 14. Communion will be distributed outside following worship.
- 15. The worship spaces will be cleaned afterwards.

The Providence Campus will limit worship to 100 people each for the 9:00 Traditional Service and the 11:00 Contemporary Service. There will be no Bridge Service at this time.


The Concord Campus will limit worship to 25 for their 10:00 Blended Service.

The South Campus, because they lack a building to meet indoors for worship, will host outdoor worship beginning on October 25 at 10:00 (weather permitting) for 100 persons.

We ask that those who choose to join us live for worship be mindful and respectful of these procedures, realizing that we all have different levels of comfort with this virus. Furthermore, we ask for everyone's patience and understanding as we figure out how to regather the people of God safely.

I'm looking forward to being reunited as a church once again. It's not complete. It's not final. But this is the first step towards that glorious goal.



About four months ago I realized how powerful a Zoom meeting could be to reconnect people. Thrivent Action Teams



Room In The Inn *Changes for 2020/21 Season*

For many years Christ Lutheran has been involved in the Room In The Inn program. Other than changing locations on our campus, it has run about the same each year. COVID-19 has changed all that.

With all the complications of transporting our neighbors from A Roof Above (formerly Urban Ministries) and then the logistics of keeping both our volunteers and neighbors safe, the decision by A Roof Above has been to establish a central location instead of individual churches. At this point in the process there are still no firm plans as to how it will run or where it will be. Our hope is that we can still utilize as many of our dedicated volunteers as we can in some capacity. But for now, we do not know how it will work. CROP Walk Thank You

Thanks to our walkers and all of our supporters for the Charlotte CROP Walk, Christ Lutheran is on the top of the leader board for donations so far this year. If you have not supported a walker yet, you can go to our team page and support a walker before its too late! We have raised over \$19,000 so far, which is well on our way to our short-term goal of \$25,000. The Charlotte Walk has earned over \$87,000 altogether, so our donation can help propel it over \$100,000!!

Christ Connections

McPIE Grant Funding

McClintock Partners in Education (McPIE) works diligently on securing resources and funding for our school year and summer programming. We are excited to announce that we have recently received several big grants!

The Longleaf grant was awarded this summer to support new machinery for McClintock's Innovation Lab. This lab is already filled with 3D printers, laser cutters, vinyl cutters, AR/VR goggles and software, and several iMac computers. To add to this library of technology, McPIE was awarded \$12,500 to supply the Innovation Lab with a new embroidery machine with cabinet, two sewing machines, and supplies. Access to 21st century technology will enable McClintock students to gain a glimpse into future careers and college dreams during the school day and during McPIE's Family Night programming (once we can get back into the building).

To support our efforts in feeding families, McPIE was awarded \$1,000 in Food Lion gift cards. These funds will enable us to continue to provide grocery bags for our neighbors in need. We are currently distributing 100+ bags of groceries per week!

Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Foundation (CMCF) awarded McPIE \$10,000 toward our Family Night programming. These funds will help provide much needed student engagement and family support. Funding from CMCF is geared toward family stability and will also be used toward Family Night Pathways Out of Poverty virtual classes for parents.

\$20,000 was awarded from the United Way / Foundation for the Carolinas fund. These funds will enable McPIE to further continue providing groceries and helping students with a virtual learning environment.

McPIE is blessed to have been awarded funding toward these much-needed programs. With the help of generous funders, McPIE's dream and mission of Creating Future Stories... Building Community... Supporting Families... and Inspiring Volunteers... So that ALL McClintock students succeed, is moving forward!





McPIE Family Nights

McPIE Family Nights has kicked off (virtually) for the 2020-2021 year! While it looks different this year, the engagement and support for McClintock students and families remains the same. Since COVID closed schools in March, we have been providing weekly STEAM Challenge Packs for students and grocery bags to help support families. No afterschool activities are currently allowed on the school campus. With the success of Spring and Summer Camp Remix, we decided to continue distributing STEAM Challenge Packs and grocery bags. Fall began with the Bits and Bytes Challenge and had students coding SCOTS on a fun backpack carabiner!

This fall, other fun challenges will include wiring circuits, constructing a wooden candy dispenser, science in a Ziploc bag, robotics, food science and MORE! Challenge Packs and grocery bags are distributed on Tuesday and Friday at McClintock. Over 100 Challenge Packs and grocery bags are distributed each week!
