

It is Time: Another Retirement at CLC

After over twenty years of serving on the staff of Christ Lutheran as the welcoming face of our church, my wife, Gretchen, is stepping down to retire. That's a long time for what I pitched to her in 2001 as a temporary position!

After we lost an associate pastor, Jeff Gardner, in 2001, I asked Gretchen to step in on a temporary basis until I could find a replacement. Her job was to be the face and voice of Christ Lutheran to visitors by greeting them at the door, going out for lunches, talking about the church, organizing new member orientations and helping them get plugged into the life of the church. Almost everyone who has joined the church in the past 20 years had Gretchen as their first impression. I can think of no one better to be in that role.

What started out as "temporary" expanded into so much more. She walked with those struggling to find a place for their family to belong and grow in the faith. She told them about what it was like to have our own children involved in the youth ministry. She talked about how the music brings us to a higher level of praise. And she maybe even said a kind word about the preaching!



Over time, Gretchen joined Mary Parker in organizing concerts in the new sanctuary with names such as Mark Schultz and Big Daddy Weave. She helped promote congregational events such as picnics, Kick-Off Sundays and banquets. As her role expanded even more, she became an extension of the pastoral office, offering a comforting, caring, listening ear to those going through life's struggles.

Gretchen began stepping away from her responsibilities at church in 2021 when her mom needed more and more of her attention. Being able to care for her mother on the final leg of her earthly journey was one of the most exhausting and fulfilling experiences of her life. In fact, through this experience, Gretchen has worked with several other people, particularly daughters, who find themselves in that same position of being the caregiver of aging parents. It is a much needed support group.

It has been a great joy of mine for Gretchen and me to share in this ministry together. We are both deeply connected and committed to the importance of the abundant life that comes through knowing and living in Christ.

She has passed on the welcoming part of her ministry into the capable hands of Kathy Hoffman, who shares that same gift of hospitality. Kathy offers that same smile and inviting presence to our guests.

Well done, Gretchen. Well done. You were the face and smile of Christ Lutheran to each visitor who came over the past 20 years. In you, they found a place to believe and belong. And I am grateful.

The temporary position has now come to an end... and you finished strong!

The secret to the remarkable spread of the Gospel was two fold. First, they met weekly for worship. Second, they gathered in small groups, mostly in one another's home.

As Christians on our own spiritual journey, we will encounter all manner of joy and trial. God knows what life can throw at us and has given us the Church to make it through life. Just like the early Church, we at Christ Lutheran break down into small groups.

SMALL GROUPS TAKE MANY FORMS

The classic Small Group has 4-10 people who gather regularly and study the Bible. That can be with a Bible study found in bookstores, online, or by simply reading the Bible and talking about how what was read might apply to the world. These groups tend to have time to socialize while they meet – having coffee, snacks, or even whole meals. The group does what works best for them.

Other Small Groups gather around different themes. Some share a meal or watch a movie. Some are into hiking or reading books. The point is that whatever that focal point is, we do life *together*. And in doing life together, we grow in faith and in community.

SMALL GROUPS RESTART

Since Covid, we have all had our lives disrupted. It's time to rebuild. To that end, we will soon be reaching out to the leaders of our existing Small Groups to offer any needed support, as well as recruiting & training members who'd like to create new small groups. Here's how to get involved:

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SENIORS: A Discussion About Protecting Your Medicare

Sunday, August 28 • 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. at Christ Providence (Forum)

Dr. Doug Robinson from Healthcare Justice – NC will talk about a little-known government program that threatens to eliminate traditional Medicare and permanently undermine the quality of healthcare for seniors.

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services "Innovation Center" has recently announced that by 2030, they plan to move all Traditional Medicare enrollees into a "care relationship" with a 3rd party middleman. Those investor-owned companies can then restrict patient care, and in doing so keep as much as 40% of Medicare payments as profit. All this will be done without seniors' knowledge or consent, and with no Congressional oversight. That's really bad medicine! Attendees will learn about this stealthy program and what they can do to help stop it. More information can be found at *protectmedicare.net*.


