## **The Big Rocks**

That's what we call them at Church Council. The Big Rocks. These are the goals for 2023 as laid out in the beginning of the year to always keep in front of us. As we reviewed them again on October 16, we can see just how much we've accomplished this year:

**Good Soil Campaign** With the closing of Christ South, we gave people the option on what to do with their gifts to this capital campaign to build a worship center on that land. Some redirected their gifts to the General Fund or a special project, but most kept it in that fund for whatever we envision for the future for that land.

**Southland Task Force** This team has been working all year to present to the congregation a new vision for the land. Many ideas have been considered. We hope to have something to present to Council in December, followed by town meetings in January leading up to a vote at the Annual Meeting at the end of January.

**Thrive** We worked with the board of Thrive School to help devise a strategy that is both financially sound and beneficial to children with special needs. After years of supporting Thrive, offering them space and money, that process has lead to Thrive leaving Christ Providence and Christ Concord to venture out on their own. We wish them great success.

**Affordable Housing** This has proven to be the most challenging of our goals. The hope was to be a catalyst to assist local families with affordable housing. That task became larger than our capacity. It is our vision to assist families and to work closely with local agencies who have greater resources and abilities.

**Evangelism Strategy** I hope this one never goes away because everyday evangelism, sharing our faith and welcoming the outsider, should be something that never leaves our heart. Who is that one person God has placed on your heart to invite to church? Remember, it takes seven invitations!

**CLCC Expansion into Kindergarten** We looked into expanding our excellent preschool to include Kindergarten. Unfortunately, because of requirements and codes, this just was not possible.

**Lessons Learned from Christ South** We spent some time in introspection, looking back at the closure of Christ South, what we learned and how we can improve for the future. There were a lot of lessons learned including more congregational communication, better singular focus by leaders on the mission and clearer expectations.

**Music and the Community** How can we open up our facilities to both advance the beauty of music and engage better with the community? Through many schools and community musical ensembles using our space to hosting Tasha Layton's concert on October 27, we feel we are good partners with the community and welcoming people to Christ Lutheran.

**Strategy for Capital Improvements** The carpeting and HVAC are ten years old. Walls need to be painted. We have a fountain that doesn't work. This year we have put together a strategy timeline and set aside funds to ensure that our campus is well cared for and reflects the beauty of God's house. Love that new carpet and tile work!

**Christ Concord** We are one church with three campuses. Each needs our attention and resources. This past year I am pleased to welcome Lay Pastor Willie Pinson to our staff who will provide the leadership and care that this campus needs.

During this month of Thanksgiving, I am thankful for all the hard work our congregation has put in to reflect more of the love and grace of God to our community.

EW SERMON SERIES

Triggers. We all have them. Those triggers that set us off and illicit a response in us that is almost visceral. Could be that employee at work who is always late. Could be the socks that never make it to the hamper. Could be all those pop-up ads on my feeds. What are your triggers? In the church, there are triggers for people that are often unfounded, a misreading of the biblical texts. Let's reduce the triggers!

#### **October 29 · You Must Be Perfect**

Jesus said to the Pharisees, "You must be perfect as your Father in Heaven is perfect." That's a trigger, because I am not perfect. So what hope is there for me if perfection is the bar? On this Reformation Sunday, we come longing for a word of Grace!

#### November 5 • Where is Grandma Now?

On this All Saints Sunday, we remember those who have died with love and affection. But where are they now? Some talk about Grandma up in heaven, looking over us, reunited with her family. Others talk about the general resurrection of all the dead at the second coming. So, where is Grandma?

#### November 12 • America: Ride or Die

We'll have just gone through another election in our country on November 7. Nothing triggers us like the animosity we hear surrounding politics. What does the Bible say about government and God's divine providence in our leaders? Romans 13 is definitely a trigger.

#### November 19 • You Are Not the Boss of Me!

Another trigger in our lives is sexism. We do not live in the patriarchal past where wives are to obey their husbands. However, the Bible does talk about this relationship in a way that triggers many. Are they understanding this text correctly?

#### STARTING DECEMBER 3... Made In My Image

We are made in the image of God. With this likeness comes the freedom and temptation to assume the role of creator ourselves. Instead of looking for definition from God, we project our own image upon Him. We may think to ourselves, "If I were God..." As enticing as this may be, it leads to a limited view of who and how God really is. This sermon series will look at four different views humankind has imposed upon our understanding of God to discover that God cannot be put in a box.

#### December 3 · Santa

This is the time of year when Santa Claus is coming to town! When we think of God, are we thinking of Santa Claus or wanting a Santa Claus type of God... like a grandfather-type who is jolly, holly and gives us presents? Perhaps we think, "If I were God... I would give everyone what they wanted!" When we only think of God as giving us what we want, we come up empty handed. God indeed gives us good things and works all things for our own good, but what does "good" really mean for us in the bigger picture?

#### December 10 • Judge

Opposite of our notions of a holly-jolly God is the image of Divine Judge. We may imagine that God is always judging us and ready to pronounce our sentence. Or we might wish for more active judgment and think: "If I were God... I would judge all the bad in the world and get rid of it." While there is a battle waged between good and evil, thinking of God as a wrathful and angry judge is also a skewed and limited image. There is so much more. Our relationship with God may include judgement, but it does not stop there.

## COMMUNITY SPOTLICHT: Javesca Feeds

Founded in 2014, Javesca Feeds is a ministry that puts action to our call as Christians to be the hands and feet of Jesus in a world that needs it so badly. In Matthew 25, Jesus used the parable of the talents to teach us to serve Him in serving others, which is the primary goal of this ministry. Javesca Feeds strives to end hunger and malnutrition in the United States and around the world by providing crisis relief and sustainable improvements in order to break the cycle of poverty. We partner with local churches and organizations within the communities served, purchase food locally to help boost their economies and empower families through life-giving relationships and consistent presence. The challenges in these geographical areas are multifaceted and vast in that we assist with the feeding while other ministries assist with the medical care and other needs in those villages/towns. Our current ongoing efforts are directed toward some of the poorest communities in Charlotte, Guatemala, Cambodia and Burundi.

Having no paid staff, Javesca Feeds operates through a volunteer Board and team who work to raise funds and establish partnerships in communities in the U.S. and other countries where families experience ongoing food insecurity and malnutrition. As a Board member, I have readily seen that every ministry decision is made with a singular vision... that everyone is fed. Thus far, we have had the privilege of providing ~2 million meals in these impoverished places; and with your help, we can serve even more. The 2023 Impact Hunger event is being held November 2 at Olde Mecklenburg Brewery. Money raised will be targeted to fund our efforts into 2024 as we set the budget for meal allocations to the mentioned areas, with consideration also to expand as financial resources allow.

# Refugee Resettlement Team Update

The Christ Lutheran Refugee Resettlement Team has been hard at work trying to aid the Osmani family who fled Afghanistan when the Taliban resumed power. Muhammad worked at the U.S. Embassy, so his family continues to be targeted.

His wife and three young children are now resettled in Charlotte, but they are still trying to get other family members out. Muhammad's brother escaped Afghanistan and fled to Turkey but was captured and deported. He escaped again and is now back in Turkey trying to get out to the U.S.

CLC members, Chris & Jennifer Youse have generously offered to sponsor the Osmani family with continued support by Christ Lutheran. Church Council approved \$5,000 a year for the next two years in this effort.

The CLC youth group will sponsor a booth at this year's Alternative Gift Market with proceeds benefitting the family, so we hope a big turnout at the market will provide support not only for the Osmani's but for many other charitable efforts sponsored by the church.

In addition to our efforts working with 17 other area churches on Afghan refugee resettlement, Christ Lutheran is also working with the Circles of Welcome initiative for Ukrainian families sponsored by Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS).
