How Good, Lord, to be Here! Pastor Scott

New Sermon Series: Don't Give Up Sundays · January 16 - February 27



OVERVIEW: The series is about God entering into our lives and being present in the difficult times. We, as Christians, aren't called away from the difficult times in the world; but rather, Christ/God/His Church is present with us.

January 16 • Don't Give Up On Justice For All

Christ was made low, like humans. He came into the world to sanctify all people. He could have destroyed it and been done with us all – the Flood. He could have stayed far off and sent another prophet – Isaiah. He could have waved a "magic wand" but He chose to show love, to all. He chooses to take the form of a man and be with us, be our brother. He chooses to link arms and join with us, even die for us. Because, love isn't shown from afar, it shows up, it marches, it sits at counters and sacrifices for others. Love is a verb! *Hebrews 2:9-18; Colossians 3:11; Matthew 28:19; Philippians 2:7; John 3:16; Romans 5:8; John 1:1-14*

January 23 • Don't Stop Believin(g)

The Biblical concept of "hardening hearts" is a shutting down of God's influence in our life. Israelites did this by creating and worshiping a golden calf in the Wilderness. "Today" our hearts are hardened by becoming disillusioned. We take God for granted, treating baptism as an insurance policy instead of an invitation. Expecting that God will forgive and do my bidding; or worse, we become jaded and think that God doesn't care. We can forget who God is and whose we are and go through the motions. We, Christians, are the continuation of God's great plan. God sends His people out of Egypt and makes His people a great light for the world to see. This continues "today." Today we are the light bringers. At baptism God enlists us to bring our light into the world. Into the unique place we work and play and live. We get to pray out loud. We get to show people how God is working in their life. We get to invite all people into the house of God to experience the love of God and we don't have to worry if they are godly. We get to be the very presence of God, "partners with Christ" wherever we find ourselves. Hebrews 3:7-15; Exodus 32:1-6; John 31:36

January 30 • Don't Stop Being Authentic

Christians are hypocrites. What we believe is in writing. We fall short of that expectation. That tension between how we are supposed to act and how we actually conduct ourselves is the life of a Christian, and makes us hypocrites – and that's a good thing. We don't want to pretend that we're perfect because there is no way that's going to happen. What is better is that we keep trying. Recognizing our failings and seeking forgiveness. In this way we are living like our Lord. Jesus was perfect but did not glorify Himself. Jesus is the Great High Priest appointed by God to that position forever. He is of a bona fide pedigree: of the Order of Melchizedek. He has every reason to say "look at me" "I am special." He could have even avoided death but instead he submitted.

Our submission is admission. To confess. To recognize that we aren't perfect and then to come, again and again, back to Christ. To say to Christ and anyone who's looking "I have failed to live the life I want to live." But instead of lowering the bar, instead of accepting things for how they are — we seek Christ and His reconciliation. We come back to His table and receive His Body and Blood and are made clean, if only for the time it takes us to get back to our seats. Are we able to not sin long enough to get back to our seats? The purpose of a Christian life isn't about how perfect we are, it's about how "real" we are when we fall short. *Hebrews 5; John 13:12-18*

February 6 • Don't Give Up on Community

During the pandemic we have had to give up on gathering together in person. Yet, we are called to be a gathered people — to congregate as a people of God and worship, praise and gather around the table to be fed. Then, we go out of the doors to share this message of hope we have with the world. That is what it means to truly be a Christ-centered community. Now that we are slowly gathering back together, how can we support one another? How can we encourage one another? How can we be the church in the world that God has called us to be? *Hebrews 10:19-25; John 17:20-26*

February 13 • Don't Give Up on Stepping Out in Faith

Have you ever heard that faith is belief in action? This chapter in Hebrews outlines a number of heroes of the Bible. All of these heroes of faith struggled with taking the first step. And yet all of them changed the world. What would it mean for us to step out in faith, even when we're not sure where that foot will land? God calls us to put our belief into action. It is in that step that God guides our path. *Hebrews 11:1-3, 39-40; John 15:1-9*

February 20 • Don't Give Up on Yourself

What are some goals you have set for yourself? Exercise more? Read the Bible more? Pray more? Do you start to better yourself, but find you are your own worst enemy? We may give up on ourselves, but Jesus never does. Jesus has faith in us. And Jesus gives us power to run the race. Perseverance comes from two places — keeping our eyes set on Jesus and the community that encourages us. *Hebrews 12:1-3, Matthew 14:22-33*

February 27 • Don't Give Up on Wholeness

Do you ever wake up feeling dreary because of the winter weather? Do you miss spring and summer? Sometimes, those outside factors can lead to feelings of emptiness. Is there any tangible way to find healing and wholeness in the Word? Here in Hebrews, we read that Jesus never gives up on us. Through our struggles Jesus is our helper. With the empowerment from Jesus, we can strive for wholeness. *Hebrews* 13:5b-6, 20-21; Matthew 11:25-30 or Mark 5:25-34

EQUITY IN OUR JUSTICE SYSTEM with Judge Elizabeth Trosch

A district court judge since 2008, Judge Elizabeth Trosch has presided over

a broad range of matters, including domestic violence, criminal proceedings, juvenile delinquency, custody, abuse and neglect proceedings as well as a variety of civil cases. She is a member of the North Carolina Human Trafficking Task Force Public Safety Committee, the Mecklenburg County Anti-human Trafficking Committee and the North Carolina Interagency Collaborative.

Judge Trosch has spearheaded court reform in criminal and juvenile courts. She is the co-founder and co-chair of the Mecklenburg County School-Justice Partnership and the co-chair of the Racial and Ethnic Disparities Reduction Workgroup. She has worked to implement pretrial release policy reforms and criminal justice debt reforms and is a member of the Race Matters for Juvenile Justice Leadership Team.

In addition, she has served as the Charlotte Model Court Lead Judge, working to carry out systems change that positively impacts outcomes in child welfare cases. She has presented on the topics of trauma informed court practices, the school-to-prison-pipeline and implicit bias at state and national conferences. Judge Trosch is a recipient of the North Carolina State Bar Pro Bono Service Award.

CLC Endowment Fund Update

Do you ever wonder how the Christ Lutheran Endowment funds are used? We often talk about how much is in the funds, or how they are invested, but too often forget to talk about the impact they have. The first of Christ Lutheran's Endowment funds is directly focused on having impact "Beyond These Walls," and our Benevolence Committee chooses how to spend the distribution from this 'Fund I.' In 2020, the fund distributed \$27,756 and that money was directed toward various ministries to help others. Recipients last year included Crisis Assistance, A Roof Above, McClintock Partners in Education (McPIE), and the ELCA Synod.

Our second fund ('Fund II') is a general purpose fund which is allocated by Church Council, again often for benevolence. In 2020, Council designated \$10,000 to the mobile food ministry that our chef, Mike Wallace, leads to feed people in times of need. Mike and his wife Alicia are having a broad impact with this ministry, including providing meals to volunteers at vaccination clinics, meals for Cooperative Christian Ministries in Cabarrus County, as well as the Charlotte Rescue Mission. Again, our Endowment is helping us "Beyond These Walls" to help people in their time of need.

Our Endowment funds continue to grow, both through contributions from members of the church, as well returns on the investments made. Year-to-date, the funds have returned nearly 15%, reflecting an investment portfolio that balances risk and return. We will make distributions from these funds in early 2022 for both the Benevolence Committee and Council to direct where it is most needed. And we plan to acknowledge those who contribute to our Endowment through a Recognition Dinner on April 24th, 2022.

Lastly, we are working to bring more education to interested church members on how they can plan to have a lasting impact with their legacy. While many think that estate planning is only for the wealthy, there are actually many ways people can plan their legacy to both impact the ministries they care about, as well as continue to care for their families. We will be working in 2022 with the ELCA on educational materials and opportunities for those interested to learn more.


Looking Forward at South by PASTOR RYAN

Declutter your house after Christmas and 'save your stuff' for Donation Saturday! This is a joint event benefitting several different local non-profits:

Assist M.E. provides durable medical equipment to qualified low-income, uninsured and underinsured residents of the Charlotte area. They collect mobility-related rehab equipment (ie. canes, crutches, walkers, wheelchairs, scooters, bath aids, toilet aides, home medical beds, etc). Volunteers prepare and redistribute equipment into the community. "Previously ignored or forgotten equipment kept in garages, basements and attics finds a new purpose in a new life." Assist M.E. served nearly 400 people in 2020 and will exceed that in 2021.

Trips for Kids collects donated bikes to support their annual bicycle recycling program for Charlotte Recyclery. Donated bikes are used for the Earn-a-Bike program and are also sold to fund programming.

Crisis Assistance collects furniture and clothing donations to help our neighbors in need.
