I remember years ago whispering to my daughter, Hannah, after one of Pastor Drew's sermons, "He is so good!" She went into one of those controlled laughs you have to stifle in church until she could whisper back, "You know why you like him so much?" I shrugged. "Because he is just like you."

What a compliment, but that's not all together true. We do share the same passion for ministry, we do have a similarity in preaching style, we do have the same theology, but that pastoral heart of Pastor Drew is beyond compare.

Sad to see him go. Excited for his new adventure. Grounded in the call. Feeling blessed to have seven years together. But now we send him off with a God-Speed and words of deep gratitude, "Well done, Pastor Drew. Well done!"



RACE IS NOTHING, RACE IS EVERYTHING.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 7

A discussion on Scripture, race and justice, led by Rev. Dr. Rodney Sadler

Dr. Sadler is Associate Professor of Bible and Director of the Center for Social Justice and Reconciliation at Union Presbyterian Seminary (Charlotte Campus). A biblical scholar and faith-based justice advocate, Dr. Sadler studies the intersection of race and Scripture, the impact of our images of Jesus for the perpetuation of racial thought in America, the development of African American biblical interpretation in slave narratives, the enactment of justice in society based on biblical imperatives, and the intersection of religion and politics.

Dr. Sadler is the managing editor of the African American Devotional Bible, associate editor of the Africana Bible, and the author of Can a Cushite Change His Skin? An Examination of Race, Ethnicity and Othering in the Hebrew Bible and co-author of The Genesis of Liberation.

A tireless racial justice advocate, Dr. Sadler has been invited to serve as an expert on matters of race by Churches Uniting in Christ, the National Council of Churches, and the World Council of Churches. His activism includes work with the Community for Creative Non-Violence in Washington, D.C., Durham C.A.N., H.E.L.P. Charlotte, the U.S. Africa Ebola Working Group, the board of People Demanding Action, the Justice Action Mobilization Network (JAMN) and he has worked organizing clergy with and developing theological resources for the Forward Together/ Moral Monday Movement in North Carolina. He also serves on the board of the NC NAACP and is chairperson of their Healthcare Committee.

These students are practicing outdoors. When Kendall saw that, she realized there was more work to be done. With the help of an African architect and builder, she has determined that for \$60,000 we can build a music building for these students. How cool is that?

Remember, we have committed that for every one million dollars we raise for Christ South Worship Center, we will give away \$50,000. For the first million, we gave \$25,000 to LWR for our work in Central America and \$25,000 for our Garden Ministry. For the next million we raise, we would like to give a gift towards this music building in Ghana, along with your additional donations.


