

Pastor's Perspective

Remember Your First Love?

Do you? Do you remember your first love? For me, I'm not so much thinking about Patty in 9th grade but rather St. Stephen Lutheran in Longwood, Florida. They invited me to come back and preach on February 12 as part of their 50th Anniversary. I served there as my first call out of seminary from 1987-1995. It was such a positive and fun experience. Seminary taught me how to be a good theologian, but St. Stephen taught be how to be a good pastor.

The senior pastor took me under his wing and showed by example how important it was to be in the homes, at the hospitals, and sitting around the lunch table with the people. If you want to get better in the pulpit, you need to be in the lives of your people, celebrating their joys and mourning their losses together. It was such a wonderful call that I thought every church was like this. Honestly, I don't remember any conflict. Whenever I heard other pastors complain about fights in their churches, embattled council meetings and that one person who takes delight in making your life miserable, I thought they were overexaggerating complainers. Ministry was great!

Believe me, I have since experienced struggles in the ministry over the years, but my basic love of the parish and being involved in the lives of the people has never diminished. This is all because of my first love at St. Stephen.

But going back in February showed me that a lot has changed over the past 27 years. I didn't know nearly as many people as I thought I would. They had gone through several pastors, not all of which were good fits for the church. They had experienced divisions where many good people had left. It wasn't the same church as I had left many years ago, but that is to be expected.

A church is a living, breathing organism that continually grows. It shouldn't be the same church as it was 27 years ago. No one wants a church to remain a museum of the past glory years. But going back to St. Stephen made me realize that Christ Lutheran isn't the same church as it was when I came, either. Ministries have changed, buildings added, staff turn around, economic changes—all of which contribute to an ever evolving, growing church.

Most recently, Christ Lutheran experienced another change with the closing of Christ South. It was a good vision, a bold vision that for several reasons just didn't unfold the way that we had envisioned. Instead of mourning the loss or trying to recapture the past or blaming one factor, the question we need to be asking now is What opportunities does this change provide in moving forward? Or, put in a more churchy way, What does love require of us now?

After much reflection, I have a couple of thoughts.

PAUSE Often you hear people say, "Don't just sit there, do something!" With the closure of South, I'm going to reverse that. "Don't just do something, sit there." This is not a time for quick action but for intentional pause to let us grieve, reflect, remember and celebrate.

CARE Many people came to faith through South. Many people of all campuses invested in this start up. During this time of pause we care for one another by listening to the stories and walking alongside the questions.

DREAM And when the time is right, we open ourselves up to dream big once again. God will provide a new vision and opportunity, I'm sure of that. And love will require that when that time comes, it will be time for us to move boldly forward in faith as we have done so many times in the past.

That first love, whether it is a person, a church, a job, a house or a car, often is locked in our memory, never to change. But the reality is, life goes on. We are different people. And God's people have never gone back to some good old days but forward into a future where God will provide new opportunities that will take us all by surprise.

The challenge will be to heed that call. That's what love requires of us.

February 26 • You Are Called

Like Peter. God has jumped into the boat with us as Jesus calls us to cast out our nets and to follow Christ. The question is, do we continue to throw our nets on the wrong side of the boat or do we drop our nets completely and see that God has called YOU for much more than just catching fish. 1 Corinthians 12:1-11, Luke 5:1-11

March 5 • Called to be Followers of Jesus

We look at the world and get consumed by the busyness and the chaos that is all around us and we take on the responsibility to try and fix it all. We try to become the savior, the hero, the one who fixes the problems. But that is not at all what being called as a follower of Christ is all about. We are called to first sit at the feet of Christ. It is at Jesus' feet that we realize our holiness and belovedness. which then allows us to respond to God's call faithfully. Colossians 3:12-17, Luke 10:38-42

March 12 • Called Away

Callings can be challenging to discern. Often, when God calls it is not clear, or it might be a call towards something different or uncomfortable. These callings force us to rely on trusting God more than most other calls in our lives because there is no clear outcome of what is to come next. Being called away is like being called to trust in the One



who gives life, creates and provides when it seems like there is only death, an end and nothing. Grief might be the only way through, but new life is always on the other side of death. Genesis 12:1-9, Mark 1:16-20

March 19 • Called As You Are

Quite possibly the deepest truth you can recognize about yourself is the uniqueness that God has created you to be and remembering that God created you just as you are in all God's perfect ways. Even when we might feel as though God can do nothing with us, that is precisely when God calls us as we are. Jesus finds the lowly sinners and the outcasts, and it is those who He calls to not only follow Him but to help show how the kingdom of God is at hand. 2 Corinthians 12:8-10, Matthew 9:9-13

March 26 • How God Calls

God's call doesn't come through as a booming voice or a flash of light but instead through the people we surround ourselves with in community. It might not always be as clear as a burning bush, but God is calling you through the voices of others, through the silent and still moments of prayer, and through the hurts and pains of the world. God calls us into deep discernment communally to hear that call as followers of Christ, responding faithfully and boldly. Exodus 3:1-6, John 1:43-51, Acts 1:15-26

April 2 (Palm Sunday) • Called to Suffer

Following Jesus is not always easy. The reality of sin in the world means that pain and suffering remain, too. While God does not create pain and suffering, callings from God may lead us to places of suffering because of sin in the world. Despite the suffering we may endure, we live in the trust and hope of the resurrection of the dead knowing that if God has called, God remains with us. God pulls us through because God has been there, knows our suffering, and has defeated the sin that brings about the suffering. Psalm 31:9-16, Philippians 2:5-11, Matthew 21:1-11



Flower Ministry at CLC by ALICE MCRORIE

Have you ever wondered where the flowers in the Sanctuary come from? If you guessed a local florist, you would be wrong! Our flowers are arranged each week by a few talented members of the church. Early on most Saturday mornings, Barbara Handschin goes to the farmers' market for fresh flowers in season. Other weeks flowers are ordered from the local wholesale florist.

Barbara and Alice McRorie, with frequent help from Jack Whittmore and Phillip Brown, create the arrangements for the Sanctuary, Christ Chapel, Concord and the Welcome Table in the Lower Commons. It takes about three hours every Saturday morning. They also provide flowers for weddings, memorial services and special events at the church when requested.

Additional flowers and greenery are occasionally donated.

This group, with the help of lots of volunteers, also decorates the Worship Center areas for the Advent/Christmas season. They created the hanging pieces, wreaths, and table decoration in 2014. The Chrismon trees were added several years ago.

Thanks to some generous contributions, and additional funds from church council, a floral refrigerator was recently added to the sacristy. It is used to store extra flowers and arrangements for special occasions.

The total cost of the flowers is not a part of the regular church budget, so the group relies on people wanting to dedicate flowers in remembrance, in celebration of an event special to the donor, or just to the glory of God. These funds are not only used to do the weekly arrangements, but also to plan for Christmas and Easter celebrations. We are hoping that more people will step up to provide one or more dedications this year. Contact the church office or <u>signup in REALM</u> to donate flowers. Flowers can be donated for the Sanctuary, Christ Concord, or Christ Chapel. The cost is \$75 per arrangement. These dedications are a huge help in the procurement of the flowers which have increased in cost these last few years. Thank you for helping us in one of the things that makes Christ Lutheran a beautiful place to worship.

Each week through March 31st, local churches host our neighbors in need during the cold, winter months. CLC does this every Thursday evening to Friday morning. On Thursday, we pick up 8-10 folks at Roof Above and bring them to our church. Guests are each given their own room around Center Six. We provide dinner, showers, basic clothing (underwear and socks), fellowship, a hot breakfast, a to-go lunch and a ride back to uptown. It is a ministry we are very proud of!

We really could use help with overnight hosts. It is a great way to share in the lives of our RITI neighbors and give back. You can arrive at 6 p.m. and share in the dinner, or just arrive by 7 p.m. You will have your own private room as do all the guests. Most guests are asleep shortly after dinner. You wake the guests at 5 a.m., set out breakfast, get them on the van at 6 a.m. and depart afterwards. Pretty simple, and it helps our program tremendously.

This past January, when Pastor Scott started his new sermon series on Hineni, I was already experiencing my own Hineni moment. My dad had suffered from Alzheimer's for a few years and passed away last March. In August, my husband Frank and I were asked to be co-chair of the 2023 Charlotte Memory Gala. I hesitated, because if you know me, this is totally out of my comfort zone: being a co-chair means using your network of people to help fundraise for the Gala and the Alzheimer's Association. After thinking about it, I decided I could do this! There is no better way to honor my dad than to fundraise for the disease that ultimately took his life. My dad, a lifelong Lutheran, was a career Marine officer and after his retirement he was a fundraiser for many nonprofits, most notably the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. Hineni...here I am Lord, ready to serve and help your people.

Did you know ...over 6 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's? ...1 in 3 seniors die from Alzheimer's or dementia? ...or that Alzheimer's kills more people annually than breast and prostrate cancer combined? Our organization believes that Alzheimer's research and care efforts are 20 years behind where breast cancer is today. We are trying to change that.

The vision of the Alzheimer's Association is a world without Alzheimer's and all dementia. The mission of the Alzheimer's Association is to eliminate Alzheimer's disease through the advancement of research; to provide and enhance care and support for all affected, including caregivers; and to reduce the risk of dementia through the promotion of brain health.

We are helping achieve this vision by working on the 2023 Charlotte Memory Gala. Currently, we are in the midst of finding corporate sponsors, corporate and individual table hosts, silent auction items and monetary donations. The Gala itself is a black-tie affair held at the Westin Charlotte on Saturday, May 20th.

Under the direction of David M. Harris, The Raleigh Ringers has released seven CDs, and two DVDs of holiday concerts titled *One Winter Evening* at Meymandi and *A December Tradition*.
