# Start With The Big Rocks

Without a word, the professor stood in front of his class with rocks of different sizes and two identical see-through containers. In the first container, he first poured in the pebbles, then added medium-sized rocks but then only had room for a couple of the big rocks.

He then stepped over to the second container and reversed the order. He put in more big rocks, scattered around the medium-sized rocks and then finally poured in the small pebbles that scattered throughout the container, finding their way into all the small crevices, and filled up the container to the brim. Same rocks, same containers, but the second one obviously held more rocks.

Turning to the class, the professor asked, "What can we learn from this experiment?"

"You can only put in so many rocks." "There is always room for smaller rocks." "If you break the big rocks into small rocks, they could all fit."

"No," said the professor, "The lesson from this experiment is to always start with the big rocks. Once those are in place, the smaller rocks will fall into place."

January is a time for many of us to do our resolutions. As we make our lists, we all do well to start with the big rocks, knowing that if we don't, our 2023 might only be filled with a lot of small tasks and not have room for big accomplishments.

As I look at the start of this new year and consider my big rocks, I have four:

**Church Worship Attendance.** Covid has made us lazy. It has given us excuses. If a person worships once a month, we shrug our shoulders, "What can you do?" If attendance is a third of what it was before Covid, we rationalize and say, "That's everywhere." I'm not satisfied with laziness or apathy or excuses. The first mark of being a Christian is to be a person who weekly worships Christ as Lord. I need to be intentional of teaching and preaching that. I need to keep the bar high of what it means to be a believer. I need to hold this church and its members accountable to the biblical mandate to remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy.

**Stabilizing the Staff.** This past year we saw many changes on our staff. This coming year will be a time not just to fill those open positions, but to revitalize the staff, draw them closer together, align them with the same values and cast before them a God-sized vision that has always propelled us. The change in 2023 will be to strengthen our unity as a staff with the resolve to make Christ known.

**Christ South Build.** By the time this newsletter is published, we should have the permit in hand for the worship center for Christ South. Now the countdown begins. We have one year to build up that campus, establish a sustainable worship attendance of over 100, raise the necessary funds and break ground in 2023. Game on!

**Christ Concord Vitality.** Our campus to the north has also experienced its share of changes. However, with the introduction of the second worship experience called *The Gathering* for families with children having special needs, that campus is actually the first of our campuses to get back to their pre-Covid worship numbers. While we have an interim in place (see page 4), 2023 will be a time of important and strategic decisions for Christ Concord's ongoing vitality.

If I can focus on and begin with these four big rocks, I have no doubt all the medium stones and small pebbles will find a place in all of the remaining crevices.


This is what God has placed on my heart for the church in 2023. And I'm excited to see how God's Spirit will make it happen.

As we look at this new year, with Covid behind us, we are no longer satisfied with excuses and lackluster performances. As believers, it is time for us to say to this God who has made us, claimed us, forgiven us and called us, "Hineni. Here I am."

# January 8 (Epiphany) • Here I Am... to Worship

Let's be clear. It was inconvenient for the magi to worship Jesus. We don't know how far they traveled or how long it took them, but we do know that it was an intentional journey to come before Jesus and worship. The first mark of hineni, "here I am," is to come before God and worship His holy name. Hineni. --*Matthew 2:1-12; Psalm 8:1-9; Acts 2:41-42* 

January 15 (Baptism of Our Lord) • Here I Am... to Forgive (Part I)

Part One: Hollywood has a repeated story line for action-packed thrillers. Revenge. This one is personal. However, we know that this is contrary to God's principle of forgiveness. For the next two weeks, we will look at the complexity of forgiveness, justice and reconciliation using Tim Keller's most recent book, *Forgive*, as our inspiration. # Sharing the Abundant Harvest

Our community garden has produced thousands of pounds of fresh vegetables since its inception in 2018. With locations at both of our South and Concord campuses, each gardener commits to give at least 50% of their yield to help nourish our neighbors in need. This abundant harvest has been donated to Charlotte area food pantries and to families of McClintock Middle School, with which our church partners in the McPIE ministry.

In 2022, the Garden Ministry has donated over 4,000 pounds of fresh organic produce to help feed the hungry in our area. The gardeners donated 1,532 pounds while Root's Farm (a sustainably run market garden and local partner) donated 2,500 pounds.

(Jan. 8 - Feb. 19) *REVELATION – Worthy is the Lamb*: God's revelation to the apostle John reveals to us the future end time of our current world when evil and Satan will be overthrown forever. God (through our victor, Jesus) will re-establish His perfect world and imminent presence with His children. John relates the description of what is to come through written word and is shared with us in the final book of the Bible. Jesus, also known as the (sacrificial) Lamb of God, the Lamb who was slain at the cross to defeat our death in sin, is worthy of our honor and praise as victor and Savior of our lives and the central figure of the revelation. His "second coming" is prophesied throughout the Bible. He fights the final fight for us. This study will cover the book of Revelation as well as other relevant, supporting biblical Scripture.

(Feb. 6 - March 26) HE CHOSE THE NAILS - What God Did to Win Your Heart: Every gift from God reveals His love, but no gift reveals His love more than the gifts of the cross. These gifts came not wrapped in paper, but in passion. Pastor and author Max Lucado explores the many gifts that Christ provided to us at the Crucifixion: He chose to be one of us; He chose to forgive us; He chose to invite us into His presence; He chose to love us forever; He chose us to give us victory. God invites us to come, once again to the foot of the cross, to put down our burdens, look up and receive the life-giving gifts. (April 16 - May 21) HOPE IN TIMES OF FEAR - The Resurrection and the Meaning of Easter: Published in 2021, author Timothy Keller examines the life-changing meaning of the Resurrection. This is because the Resurrection of Christ brings the future power of God, that will someday heal and renew the entire world, into our lives now. Keller considers this crucial message of the Christian faith with inspiring insight and offers a new way to look at a story you think you know. # **Room in the Inn** HELP NEEDED, OVERNIGHT HOSTS

On Thursday, December 1st, Christ Lutheran began our 25th year of hosting Room in the Inn. Room in the Inn is a program sponsored and administered by Roof Above. Each week from December 1st through March 31st, local churches host our homeless neighbors during the winter months. CLC does this every Thursday evening to Friday morning. Each Thursday we pick up 8-10 folks at Roof Above and bring them to our church. Guests are each given their own room around Center Six. We provide dinner, showers, some basic clothing (underwear and socks), fellowship, a hot breakfast, a to-go lunch and a ride back to uptown. It is a ministry we are very proud of.

We really could use help with overnight hosts. Consider staying over as an overnight host. It is a great way to share in the lives of our RITI neighbors and give back. You can arrive at 6 p.m. and share in the dinner, or just arrive by 7 p.m. You will have your own private room, as do all the guests. Most guests are asleep shortly after dinner. You wake the guests at 5 a.m., set out breakfast, get them on the van at 6 a.m., and depart afterwards. Pretty simple, and it helps our program tremendously. Family Night finally completed a full semester of programming since COVID struck in 2020! While this has been a rebuilding semester, the excitement inside the building could be felt. Students and families both have been eager to receive a delicious meal and participate in classes and clubs.



# Afghanistan & Our Afghan Family UPDATE by Laurie Carter

In the last issue of Christ Connections, we shared with you information about the Afghan family we have "adopted." Since then, the Osmani family welcomed daughter Yusra Osmani, born just before Thanksgiving weighing 7 lbs 9 oz. Mom (Khatera) and baby are doing well and are home getting to know each other and assimilating into their family of five.

Thank you so much to those who have helped with baby and the other urgent needs of this family. Those needs continue, and now that Khatera has been diagnosed with MS, we anticipate other medical needs in the future. We continue to look for housing near the Islamic school where their oldest child attends. It is in the Plaza-Shamrock area. If you know of a reasonably-priced rental that may be available, please contact Amy Daniels (<u>adaniels@ christelca.org</u>).

While the Osmani family is struggling, they are fortunate to have been able to flee their homeland and evade the Taliban. They have parents and siblings still trying but unable to leave. Because of their relation to Mohammad, who worked with American forces, they are unable to gain employment and must move frequently to evade the Taliban. As a result, Mohammad also sends support to them from his meager wages as a delivery man. The situation in Afghanistan is desperate. Here are some facts:

- Political instability, extreme drought, and the pandemic have created a humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan with over 18 million in need of necessities. This year alone 550,000 have been displaced.
- Afghanistan is on pace for record civilian deaths and injuries, with the majority being women and children. Schools are closed, food shortages abound, and people are turning to desperate measures such as child labor and early marriage for girls.
- Children are facing extreme hunger, exploitation and a loss of their education, particularly girls, who are almost twice as likely as boys to go to bed hungry. Almost 1 in 2 of girls are not attending school, compared to 1 in 5 boys. Almost half of the Afghan population is going hungry. In fact, starvation could kill more Afghans than the last 20 years of war.
