Ring in the New Year

Right after Christmas there's this time, just before the new year, where almost nothing happens. In our frenetic American culture, it's truly a unique thing to experience. And at the church, it's nice to have. We've been going at a fever pitch until we reach Christmas and so there's a nice lull waiting on the other side. Almost nothing happens; but of course, there is still Ministry happening.

On Christmas Day, Thursday, December 25th, we had our Room in the Inn Ministry. Maybe you're saying how could a ministry happen on that day? But of course, that is the most beautiful ministry to happen on that day. Room in the Inn, named after Mary and Joseph's inability to find a place to stay on December 25th, is the most appropriate ministry to happen on that day and in our church. Homelessness doesn't take a rest just because it's a holiday. A dozen or so ministers will see that those who are unhoused find a place to stay in our church. They are literally doing God's work.

This is who we are. We give up our lives because our Lord gave His life. Just because that ministry or that day is inconvenient doesn't mean it shouldn't happen. In fact, that's kind of the point of ministry — it molds us. If it were easy, could it really form us? In the same way that a bodybuilder must lift heavier weights or a student must learn more difficult mathematical equations, we take on more as Christians. The more we learn about who our God is the more we realize what He has done for us, and that appreciation encourages us to deepen our relationship. Our lives are to look like our Lord's. He avoided nothing in order to give us everything.

So, where is God leading you? What does the new year look like for you and your spiritual journey? How will your faith grow this year? There are an untold number of ways in which we can engage with our Lord and what He is doing for His kingdom and our church. The most important thing you can do is to pay attention to what you're doing. Are you taking steps out of your comfort zone? Are you developing habits of devotion that create the foundation for Spiritual growth? Are you surrounding yourself with other Christians so that you can transform and be transformed together by the Holy Spirit?

If you don't know where to start, I would encourage you to experience God with the new Wednesday Bible study class called Experiencing God. I'll tell you this is the real deal. The class will be intense and meaningful — not just a Bible study to go through the motions, but in fact a way to learn how to grow in our faith.

Now, maybe you can't make it on a Sunday to a Bible study or to Wednesdays Ablaze. I get it. My whole life seems more chaotic by the day. More and more I wonder if I've married a wife or an Uber driver for a very select clientele. But my wife and I agree that it is in the inconvenience that our children see the importance of what we do. And our Lord agrees that it is by the inconvenience that we are transformed. This work of the Spirit, that we call sanctification, happens in the struggle, outside of our comfort zone, and it is what we focus on. From my perspective the most important thing we can do is start the new year on the right foot and seek our Lord.

Let me encourage you to make time. Find a Sunday School class, a Wednesdays Ablaze class or a small group to be a part of and grow with our Lord and His people.

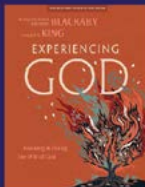

EPIPHANY SERMON SERIES: Against the Grain: Following Jesus

Overview: Many times throughout our lives we hear "Go with the flow." We learn that a "good Christian" follows the rules, obeys authorities, and goes along to get along. These can be very helpful and faithful pathways to help us navigate the many responsibilities we juggle. But in history, Scripture, and in our own experiences, we discover that our God is One who surprises us. In the very birth of God in Jesus Christ, we see that God has a different way of encountering his people. In this sermon series after Christmas, we continue to see, through Jesus Christ, the ways that God defies the expectations of his people and "goes against the grain." As followers of Jesus, we are also called, and supported, to grow into a life of faith that is full of challenge, surprise and transformation.

January 4 • The Messiah is a... Baby?

Isaiah 9:2-7 (NLT); Matthew 2:2-12 (NLT)

For centuries, the people of Israel waited for their Messiah to come. They did not expect their king to come as a vulnerable baby born in humble circumstances. No one expected their Messiah to be born in a stable. Jesus' arrival was different. People did not come from all over to pay him homage, except for some magi from the East. In their encounter, they discovered not a great mighty ruler, but a little baby, who was the very Son of God.

January 11 • It's Not Right This Way!

Matthew 3:13-17; Isaiah 53:1-3

Not much ruffled the feathers of John the Baptist. He lived in the desert. He ate locusts and wild honey and wore animal skins. He was paving the way for the Lord, proclaiming that all should turn and repent. People flocked to hear him, but when Jesus arrives and asks to be baptized by him, John, a man steeped in scripture, refuses saying that Jesus is the one who should baptize him. Even with his influential cousin, Jesus is going Against the Grain of how his ministry should begin. This reversal shows us that the Kingdom of God is going to be different.

January 18 • Radical Inclusion

Luke 4:14-30; Isaiah 61:1-3

God forged a nation, his people Israel, through the faith and family of their father Abraham. Salvation would come through the Jews. The widespread belief took on the additional meaning that salvation would come only to the Jews. Indeed, Jesus, born a Jew, brought salvation to his people, but when he speaks a message that salvation is for the Gentile too, his listeners react in an uproar. As followers of Jesus, we too are called to speak a message of inclusion of the grace of God to all.



Trying Something New

In sixth grade, my school began a new music curriculum where all students were required to enroll in either band or choir. Only because my cousin had given me a hand-me-down instrument at one point was I assigned to play trumpet, essentially by default. I learned the notes, played the scales, and went along with it, but I wouldn't say I was ever any good at it.

Less than a year passed before a family at my church caught wind of my subpar trumpeting—in a manner of speaking—and they encouraged me to pick up the French Horn instead. They were a very musical family, all of them playing in our ad-hoc church orchestra and singing in the choir. I had their support and help as I adjusted to the new instrument, and it was because of their encouragement that I was nudged towards taking music as an elective in middle and high school, playing in honor bands and going on tours along the way. Faith Fellowship: The Bible & Beyond **10:00–10:45 a.m. in Forum A&B** **—or- Christ Online (Zoom)**

(Jan. 4–Feb. 8) *Life Lessons from James: Practical Wisdom* by Max Lucado. James, Jesus' half-brother, knew that a life of faith was all about actions that revealed a difference in a person's life. As do Christians today, he believed that "works" did not save the Christian, but that they marked the Christian. His message encourages, challenges and confronts, offering constructive words and admonitions to live out our faith. Pastor and author Max Lucado's 6-session series brings the Bible to life with intriguing questions, inspirational stories and poignant reflections to take us deeper into God's Word. Each session includes an opening reflection, background information, an excerpt of the Biblical text, exploration questions, inspirational thoughts from Pastor Lucado, and a closing takeaway for further reflection.

(Feb. 15–March 29) *The Seven Greatest Words of Love* by Rick Warren. In the final hours of Jesus' life on earth, He made 7 statements as He was dying on the Cross. Through His final words, we learn God is holy, sin is ugly and salvation costly. Yet, out of love, Jesus paid the price for our sins. Pastor Warren has chosen a single word defining each of the statements to express its profound meaning to participants — forgiveness, assurance, love, substitution, humanity, victory and trust.

(April 12–May 17) *Nurturing Your Faith Series: Prayer*. Pastor Max Lucado will open our 6-session study of prayer with a compelling sermon titled "We Do Not Know How to Pray." Following will be a 4-session video series produced by Lutheran Hour Ministries and narrated by Rev. Don Everts exploring 4 different types of prayer in the believer's life. Prayers of Intercession, Gratitude, Confession and Praise are considered in various scriptural settings by highlighting a particular prayer's context, who offered it, why, and how God worked through it on behalf of His people. He speaks of how the primacy of prayer in the life of God's people is central in Scripture beginning in Genesis around the time of Adam and Eve's son, Seth, and ending in Revelation with the apostle John's petition to Jesus: "Amen. Come Lord

Jesus." Complimentary to our study is Dr. Charles Stanley's book *Deepening Your Prayer Life*. He emphasizes how we should communicate with God, freely and conversationally, first by speaking and then listening to what He has to say in return. He reveals that our prayers go beyond mere human interaction in that it gives us access into the very throne room of God because of our position in Christ, a privilege of our salvation. Therefore, we can be bold in believing God will accomplish what He promised He would do in our lives. —Led by Barbara Burton, Milt Marin, Miriam Morrison, and Barbara Anderson

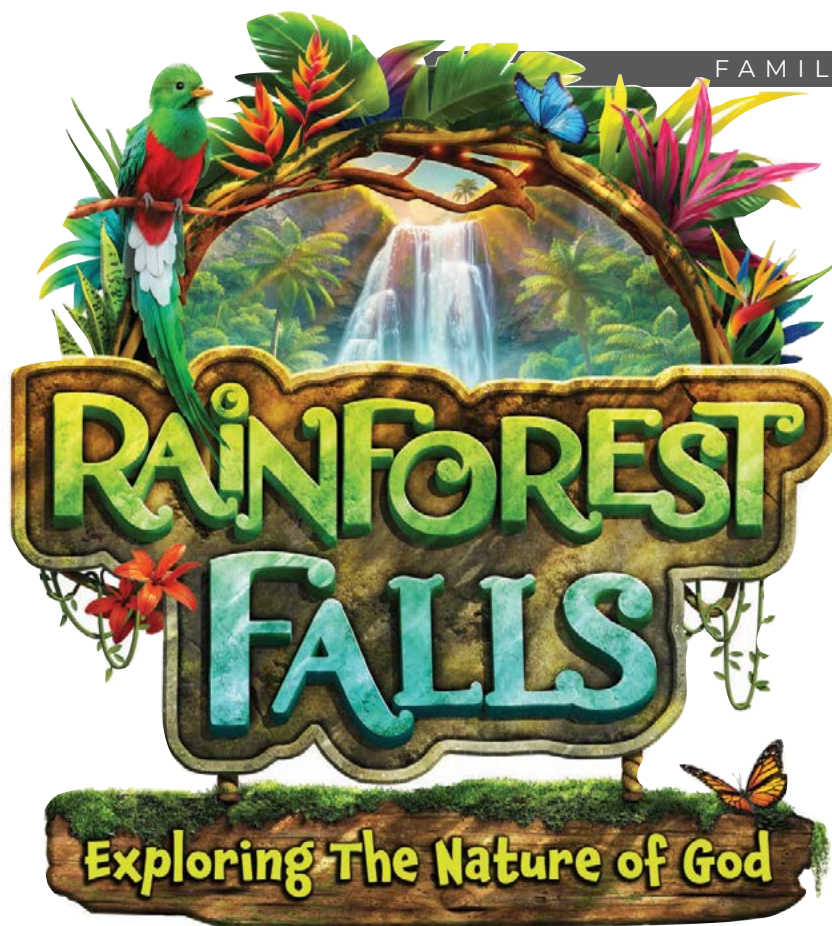
