Tom Kramer was also on staff as the manager of our gift/bookstore, Cornerstone Gifts. With an extensive background in sales and marketing, particularly online, Tom did a remarkable job transforming that store into a vibrant place that changed inventory frequently, resulting in raising enough money to giveback to our Outreach Ministries. Well done, Tom!

And after 10 years on staff, **Gregg Huether** has resigned as our Finance and Property Manager. This will be a big loss for me personally. I brought Gregg on as one of my closest friends to run the day-to-day operations of the church from maintenance to vendors to personnel to property set-up to scheduling to everything financial. And he was exceptional. The Council, Finance Team and I had so much confidence in his ability, passion and hard work. The only reason that I could teach, preach, lead a staff and cast a vision was because everything ran so smoothly under Gregg's watchful eye. We wish him the very best in what God has in store for him next.

We also must say goodbye to **Deacon Kenny Champagne**. I had so hoped to keep him following his ten-month internship with us, but evidently the Holy Spirit had different plans. We have enjoyed Kenny's ministry among us, a quiet and competent presence who made a deep impact during his short time with us. We send him off after confirmation on August 27 back up to the DC area to be reunited with his wife and two dogs!

However, with change comes new opportunities. Beginning August 7, I am thrilled to have **Pastor Adrienne Martin** join our staff as Pastor and Director of Family Ministries. She comes with a sharp mind, finishing up her third master's degree, a pastoral heart that is clearly evident when you first meet her, and a strong sense of collaboration with others on a team. Welcome Pastor Adrienne!

Joining her on August 7, we have two youth directors. **Tyler Weller**, a longtime member who participated in our youth ministry, The Xperience, and SpiritSong, will join us as the full-time Youth Director working with both middle and high school youth. Along with Tyler, we are excited to welcome (again) **Natalya Legvold**, who will work closely with Tyler on all things youth as a part-time Youth Ministry Advisor. After 23 years of teaching middle school choral in CMS, Willie has retired and now will join our staff to lead the team primarily at Christ Concord with additional responsibilities at Christ Providence. You've known him as a marvelous singer for SpiritSong. You've seen him as the Director of Freedom School at CLC. Now you will know him as Pastor Willie as he joins our pastoral team.

With change comes anxiety, particularly with the leaving of four significant staff members who have left a deep impact on the ministries of Christ Lutheran. But with change comes great opportunity for what God has in store for us. And for that, I am excited.

While you may not perform miracles, where do you see the hand of God confirming the vision that is in your heart? --1 Kings 17:8-24

September 24 • Going Into Battle

Your vision and God's purpose will always engage in battle with a world that is opposed to the things of God. Elijah took on 450 prophets from Ba'al in a battle royale that would rival any cage match you've ever seen. What empowers us to overcome the battles that we inevitably will face? --1 Kings 18:17-40

October 1 · Sick and Tired

Even Elijah had moments when it was too much, and all he wanted to do was run away, crawl into bed and pull the covers over his head. I bet you have felt the same way. In those moments, God comes not by yanking the covers off and dragging you by the ankle back into the field, but with a still small voice that assures you that you are not alone. --1 Kings 19:1-3, 9-18; John 16:12-15

October 8 • Finishing Strong

The mark of a life well-lived is a strong finish. A marathon is not for sprinters, but for those who

persevere. Elijah finished strong as he passed the mantel to his successor, Elisha. Paul finished strong when he ran the race to the end and kept the faith. How can you finish strong? --2 Kings 2:1-14; John 14:12-17; 2 Timothy 4:7-8

OVERVIEW: Generosity is less about the amount and more about the heart. And we know that God is all about the heart. Brothers in Faith by PASTOR RYAN

It *is* possible to have deep and profound faith. Faith that will sustain you your whole life. Faith that, unfortunately, most never know. When we think about faith we tend to think about our personal relationship with God. That faith is as strong as we are, and let's be honest, we are not always as strong as we think we are.

The faith that God wants you to have is a deep and profound faith that bolsters us when times are tough. In Acts 4 when the disciples were being attacked by the religious authority, they didn't pray to be spared but prayed to be even bolder. They were not afraid. They did not question their faith. They knew their God and their prayer was to rise to His level of glory together.

Have we stopped asking God to send us and started asking God to intercede and protect us? What is more, maybe you also hear on the news and social media about how we are, as a nation, lonelier and isolated. We have lost our connection with each other. Our faith is no longer our sword and shield.

Seeking discipleship with one another provides an environment for individuals to deepen their beliefs, understanding, and connection to faith. You can deepen your faith. You can fill your life with meaningful, faithful relationships that you keep for a lifetime.

These are fantastic claims. I get that. I stand behind all of them. This is my life's work and, literally, the stuff that gets me out of bed. My prayer is constant: "How can I help people know you, LORD?" Brothers in Faith is that answer.

To join Brothers of Faith you will be assigned a group. It's best not to be with men you are close friends with. You will commit to meeting regularly for a time, 12-18 months at first. Your group will be a sacred space. It will be sacred because you will come to care about the group and the men, and the other men will do the same. You will develop relationships that will be life changing. You will grow to know our LORD more deeply and be able to see, understand and trust Him on a profound level.

Brothers in Faith may not be for you. When we come to God we have to submit; it is not optional. We have to sacrifice good things for our LORD who is better. It is in these moments, where we realign our priority to be and be with God, that we are transformed. And I promise you, if you lose your life in this manner, if you reorder your priorities for Christ's sake you WILL find the best life and priorities.

I cannot over "sell" this. It is life changing. It is as God intended for us. When we follow in His ways we receive all the blessings He intends for us. If you are a man, I implore you: sacrifice a year and try Brothers in Faith. See if your life is forever changed.

Faith Fellowship: The Bible & Beyond

SEPTEMBER 17 - OCTOBER 22. *Relying On The Holy Spirit* - *Discover Who He Is And How He Works*. Who exactly is the Holy Spirit? How does He work in our lives? Big changes are in the works for the Xperience and our Youth Ministry this fall! In July, Christ Lutheran was represented by a group who traveled directly across the border from McAllen, Texas to Reynosa, Mexico. In the 20-minute drive it took to go from McAllen to Reynosa, we saw the world change. We met and worked with wonderful, kind, hard-working people who struggle to meet their everyday needs simply because of where they live.

Our primary objective was to work with volunteers, staff members of Faith Ministry (our non-profit partner in this mission), and members of the Cortez-Garibay family to help build a house for their family during the week. Thanks to the generosity of Christ Lutheran's benevolence funds, we paid the cost of the house for the family (\$7,000). Without the help of Faith Ministry and Christ Lutheran, this family would have never been able to realize the dream of having their own home. Miguel, the father, works at a local tire store, and earns about \$55 per week. They are a delightful family, and are very grateful for the "leg up" in their journey. We also gifted them with quilts made by the CLC quilters group and various knitted items made by our CLC knitters.







You might be interested to know that since their founding in 1994, Faith Ministry (based in McAllen, Texas), with the help of individuals and congregations across the United States, has built over 2,000 homes for families in need! Faith Ministry focuses on four primary areas: Housing, Community Wellness, Education & Empowerment, and Spiritual Growth.

During the week we also visited Faith Ministry's medical clinic where a daily nutrition program is held to help provide children with at least one nutritious meal each day. Bible stories were shared, songs about faith were sung, and lots of fun play happened! The children look forward to it each day. A nurse at the clinic provides basic care for members of the community, especially for mothers and newborn children.

The largest need in the Reynosa community during COVID was food. Many could find some sort of shelter (albeit often in a ramshackle hut made of whatever material they could find and carry home), but access to food was very difficult. Accompanied by Faith Ministry's Pastor Carlos, we visited several needy families who relied on the monthly visit and bag of essential food supplies that we delivered.

We made lifelong friends in Reynosa. We just happen to be separated by miles, a river and a border. If you want to see what life is like in another part of the world, and help make a difference, one at a time, please consider joining us next summer.
