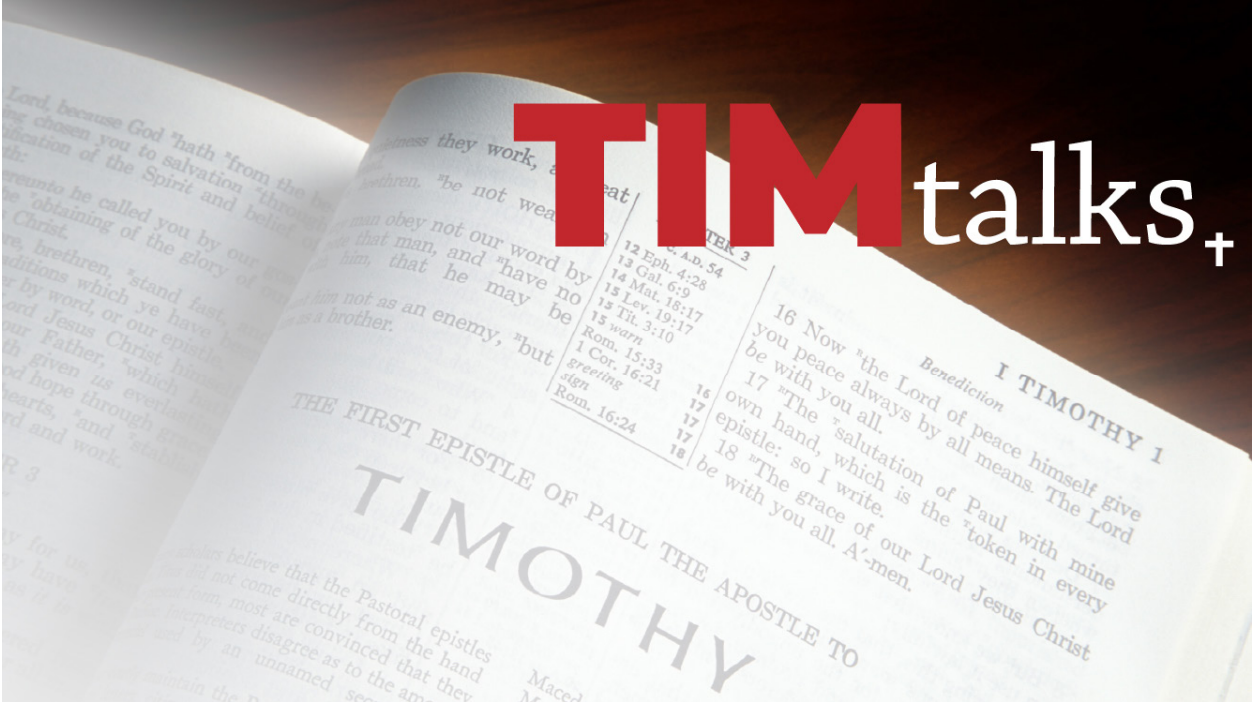

NICENE CREED
