APOSTOLIC GREETING (stand)

Leader: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

People: And also with you.

OPENING DIALOGUE

We gather as Holy Week begins, assembled as were the crowds on that first Palm Sunday.

(waving palm branches and shouting with enthusiasm):

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna to the Son of David! Hosanna!"

Let us pray: O God, we give thanks for your acts of love through your Son by which you have saved us. We remember today how Jesus entered Jerusalem in triumph, hailed as King of Kings by those who scattered palm branches in his path. On this day, bless these branches and those who bear them. Empower us not only to follow Jesus throughout this Holy Week, but also commit ourselves to him as Lord and King all our days.

Amen, Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

When Jesus drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent ahead two of his disciples, saying, "Go into the village. There you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat; untie it and bring it here. If any one asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' tell them, 'The Lord has need of it.'" So they went away and found it as he had told them. And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?"



HOLY GOSPEL John 12:12-19 (NIV)

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 12th chapter.



The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the king of Israel!" Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, as it is written: "Do not be afraid, Daughter Zion; see, your king is coming, seated on a donkey's colt." At first his disciples did not understand all this. Only after Jesus was glorified did they realize that these things had been written about him and that these things had been done to him. Now the crowd that was with him when he called Lazarus from the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to spread the word. Many people, because they had heard that he had performed this sign, went out to meet him. So the Pharisees said to one another, "See, this is getting us nowhere. Look how the whole world has gone after him!"





NICENE CREED






WORDS OF INSTITUTION



Foot Washing is a practice dating back to the Old Testament where typically slaves, the lowliest of servants, washed the feet of guests coming into the house.

At the Last Supper, Jesus scandalized his disciples by taking a basin of water and a towel to wash their feet. They wouldn't have it, but he insisted, telling them, "As I have washed your feet, you should wash one another's feet." It is an act of humility and service to one another.

Today, throughout the morning. Pastor Ryan will be in the Upper Commons in the alcove near the men's restroom to practice this act of love and service by washing the feet of others. You are invited to join him anytime on this Palm Sunday.
