November 5 • Where is Grandma Now?

Luke 23:32-43; 1 Corinthians 15:51-54 On this All Saints Sunday, we remember those who have died with love and affection. But where are they now? Some talk about Grandma up in heaven, looking over us, reunited with her family. Others talk about the general resurrection of all the dead at the second coming. So, where is Grandma?

November 12 • America: Ride or Die

Romans 13:1-7; Mark 12:13-17

We'll have just gone through another election in our country on November 7. Nothing triggers us like the animosity we hear surrounding politics. What does the Bible say about government and God's divine providence in our leaders? Romans 13 is definitely a trigger.

November 19 • You Are Not the Boss of Me!
