 - 1. God often uses nobodies to be somebodies
 - 2. A coincidence is God trying to remain anonymous

 - D. The request of Mordecai: "For if you keep silence...relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another place but you and your father's house will perish. And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this."
